A two-tone stucco facade, use of geometrically-patterned leaded glass, large rectilinear brackets (at the entrance), and wide eaves with projecting rafter ends all speak to Craftsman influences. The roof dormers are of interest, particularly for the short posts that support deep cornice returns.
