North of house about 3' is a 3 bay shed, 1 story, gable roof, shiplap siding, which may date to late 19th century. To east is barn, 1½ story, shiplap siding, gable roof. On property is also a recent garage building and an inground swimming pool (south of house).

SIGNIFICANCE:	1
The Garret and Maria Ackerman House is an interesting example of early frame domestic architecture. Its 1½ story massing of two attached blocks and its regular fenestration with belly windows in friezes is characteristic of local vernacular architecture in the early 19th century. The house is an unpretentious house of small size with few decorative features. While remodelled and enlarged since recorded by the Historic American Building Survey in 1936,the house's main facade maintains the massing, roofline, and many other features evident then. Modifications, while not arche – ologically correct, are understated and compatible. While the Historic American Building Survey calls this house the Van Buskirk-Ackerman House, its first residents were probably Thomas and Maria Ackerman. According to one source, Thomas Van Buskirk gave the house to his daughter Maria when she married Garret A. Ackerman in 1824 (Ackerman Homesteads, p. 89). A circa 1838 date is given, for the building by Helen Ester Inskeep and Mark M. Inskeep on their 1964 map. The building appears to be at this site on the 1840 U.S. Coast survey map. Its vernacular style with belly windows is typical for Bergen County houses in the early 19th century. So either the 1824 or 1838 date is plausible. The house remained in the Ackerman family into the 20th century. It was remodeled and enlarged about 1937. In 1956 it was the	9
