The house is one of the best intact examples of the Queen Anne style as applied to miners' housing remaining in Louisville. Both interior and exterior retain a high degree of integrity. It also addresses the following RP3 concerns: a resource that clarifies the role of ethnics within a coal mining town (Italians); a resource that clarifies rail town's physical form; and provides information on housing for miners.
