STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1683, Arent Schuyler bought from the Minisi Indians living in this area, 5,500 acres on June 16, 1695 for merchandise and wampum worth ±250 with other purchasers Anthony Brockholst, Samuel Bayard, George Ryerson, John Mead, Samuel Berrie, David and Hendrick Manderville from Proprietors of the East Jersey Company. These family names remain today here.

Captain Schuyler had won his commission in the British Army in the Indian wars between the French and English in Canada and was familiar with this territory when he was sent to treat with the Indians by the Governors of New York and New Jersey. Here he built his home in 1695 in the "wonderous beautiful valley" on the banks of the Ramapo River. He moved to New Barbadoes Neck (Belleville) in 1710, where he operated a copper mine.

Here, Captain William Colfax, who had come from Connecticut and was second in command of General George Washington's Life Guards, met, courted and then married Hester Schuyler, daughter of Casparus Schuyler, granddaughter of Arent Schuyler, on August 27, 1773. They raised 3 sons-Schuyler, whose own son was to become vice-president of the United States under U.S. Grant, -Dr. William and George Washington Colfax. The last two were residents of the town.

George and Martha Washington came to the house when his namesake was christened. Mrs. Washington knitted a nightcap for George Colfax which is now in the possession of Dr. Jane Colfax. Other items of interest are chairs occupied by Washington, a Warner mirror (1741) Lafayette crockery, beaver hat belonging to George Schuyler, poke bonnet of Hester Colfax, cannonballs and other relics found on the property.

Fourteen slaves lived here in 1861 and into the 1900's.

A most interesting observation is the eighth gneration of Colfax's occupy the home today. It is one of few homes in our country, built before 1700, never sold and is still lived in by descendant of the original owner. Dr. Colfax and her brother, Dr. Richard Colfax of Pompton Lakes remain as direct descendants.
