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Lost Canyon Cowboy Camp(ranching theme):

The Lost Canyon Cowboy Camp is similar to the one at Cave Springs in many ways. The main features of the Camp are the material culture items and inscriptions, not any built features. The Camp is located under a natural rock overhang. The material culture items included a fully stocked cookbox, benches, and various bottles and cans. The walls of the rock overhang are filled with many inscriptions and drawings left by the cowboys over the years. The Camp was abandoned after the National Park Service ended grazing in the area and the cultural items were left in <u>situ</u>. Therefore the interior is considered significant. There are no built features in the camp, and a nearby corral has been severely impacted by erosion and is not considered as contributing to the camp.
