trim shape unique; small attic windows flank each chimney. Looking fireplace in cellar, entrance on N.E. end.

Interior not seen. Records in file indicate a 3 room plan; corner winding stair w closed stringer to corner, turned newell; G.R. mantels; mortised & tenoned and pegged framing members. Panelled window jambs can be seen from exterior.

Brick wing added on SW end and 1 story shed porch across front and N.E. end, hipped porch on rear. House painted white.

House built on hill above big bend in N. Cebhorn Creek w grand view toward Sand E. Yard N.E. of house contains old smoke house, frame quarters and other (photos 3, 4) minor buildings, new garage; stone smoke house gone. Land said to contain an old mill site, rock quarry, and Indian graveyard (many arrowheads have been found). Patterson graveyard stones gone.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at a fence corner E of the house, thence SW with fence 200 ft to B at another corner, thence NW 260 ft to C, thence parallel to A-B 200 ft NE to D, thence with fence 260 ft SE to the beginning, containing the stone house, frame quarters - about 1 1/5 acres.
