The white clapboard Kittleson house is an American Foursquare, defined by its two-story cubical form and hipped roof. Each plane of the roof has a gabled dormer with a small square window to light the attic. An element of Queen Anne influence is seen in the decorative shinglework used in each dormer. A broad hip roofed porch supported by four round posts extends across the entire front facade. Beneath the porch, a shallow bay window is located to the right of the central door. A onestory enclosed porch protects the back entrance.

## ARCHITECTURAL/ENGINEERING SIGNIFICANCE

Of the three American Foursquare houses in Barneveld, the Kittleson house is the best and most intact example of the type. The house at 108 W. Wood has a dentil-trimmed porch supported by bracketed posts, but the aluminum siding and general poor condition of the house are detracting factors. The house at 204 W. Wood has no architectural features except for eaves brackets, which do not contribute to its exemplification as an American Foursquare. It has also been altered by the enclosure of the front porch. Thus, the Kittleson house is the American Foursquare house with the most integrity remaining in Barneveld, representing a typical early 20th century building form now rather unique in Barneveld.
