DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Rangeley Public Library, designed by Ambrose Walker of New York City and built in 1909 by F.W. Cunningham & Sons of Portland, is a very fine and well preserved example of late modified Romanesque Revival style public building.

The Library consists of a 1½-story structure with basement, with walls of local fieldstone and trim of granite from North Jay, Maine. Its steeply-pitched hip roof is covered with slates and metal sheathing. On each of the four sides of the roof is a dormer with shed roof; the facade and rear dormers each contain a pair of single-sash windows of 9 panes each; the side dormers each contain a single 12-paned window.

The three-bayed principal facade, which faces east, features a recessed central entrance above a short flight of granite steps. Below an arched and bracketed hood (which extends from the roof) is a slightly arched granite lintel upon which is carved the words "PUBLIC LIBRARY". The recessed door, flanked by 6-paned sidelights, is panelled and contains an 8-paned window. To either side of the entrance is a 12/12 window flanked by narrow 6/6 windows, all below a stone arch and fitted with a granite sill. The windows on the rear and ends of the library are equivalent, the ends of the building containing one bay.

A basement window is positioned under each bay on all sides of the library. These consist of 8-paned single sash windows framed by granite lintels and sills.

Internally the building is in good condition. The half story was remodelled in 1960 and the reading room has been upgraded through the years with the provision of additional shelving. Woodwork and other details of the interior, however, have not been altered or damaged.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Rangeley Public Library is a small structure of unusual charm and grace suited exactly to the ambiance of this early summer resort region. Built entirely of native Maine materials and designed by Ambrose Walker of New York City in a modified Romanesque Revival style, it is sited on a side street in Rangely village which runs down to the shore of Rangeley Lake.

The Rangeley Lake region, lying deep in the heart of a heavily forested and mountainous area that reaches northwest across the Canadian border, attracted sportsmen as early as the 1860's. The forests then were teeming with game and the lakes filled with various game fish. By the 1870's the scenic beauty and relatively cool summer temperatures brought an increasing number of seasonal visitors and the area became a popular resort center.

As in the case of many another summer colony, Rangely drew to it people accustomed to and interested in cultural facilities not the least of which was an adequate library. At first a largely donated collection of books was housed in a corner of Mrs. Emma McCard's dressmaking establishment. In 1907 a Library Association was formed and after a brief but successful fund drive land was acquired and the library building begun. Dedication exercises were held on August 12th, 1909, with a dedicatory address by Prof. Henry L. Chapman of Bowdoin College. The cost of the building was \$8,500.

This free library now possesses a substantial collection of over 12,000 volumes as well as periodicals and recordings.
