## Significance (cont.)

present house. The large-scaled brick house takes the form of a modified cube topped with a pyramidal roof. The plan is basically the central passage type with a semi-octagonal projection on one corner. The gingerbread porches have been replaced with a monumental portico on the main floor, but the original interior finishings have survived intact, including metal, painted tile and wooden mantels and rather mechanistic wooden detailing in the doors and the staircase.
