18. Description It is a three-bay, two-story brick structure with Gothic Revival detail including ornate bargeboard in the central gable. The front entrance is framed by a one-story porch supported by clustered posts that are decorated with ornate trim. There is an unusual iron grill in the side gable. 19. History This house was built upon land that was originally part of the Brengman farm most of which was bought by Capt. Goslee who built "The Anchorage". The origins of this house are obscure but it evidently existed before the railroad or the tracks were laid almost across its front entrance in 1849. 20. Significance This unique structure is a prime example of the Gothic Revival as encouraged by A.J. Downing in the mid-nineteenth century.
