PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION: Describe present appearance of structure/site, then contrast and compare that with its original appearance, noting additions, alterations, and changes in materials. Discuss significant architectural features.

A rectangular brick commercial structure. Brick work is down with stretcher course. Has a flat roof and papapet walls. On the south facade is a recessed doorway in the center, with large single pane windows on either side. A wood frame, tin covered awning extends in front of the south entry. Above the porch roof are two long, narrow small square multipane skylight windows. In the center between the windows, above the door, is a signboard which reads "Federated." The bottom front windows on the south facade have been covered by metal mesh to prevent vandalism. The east elevation has two arched windows and one display window, which are boarded up. The northern, rear portion of the building has a cinder block addition with a shed roof.

HISTORICAL INFORMATION: Describe the persons, important events, and/or historical patterns associated with the structure/ site and surrounding area.

This land was originally owned by George Pease, with no improvements. In 1920 lots 14-16 were purchased by the Lodge Grass Merchandise Company, and \$6500 worth of improvements on the property were made. This represents the construction of this building. The building was used, at first, as a hardware store. J.J. Ping acquired this store in 1930. James Jackson Ping was born in Kentucky in 1881. In 1911 he moved to Missouri and married Ruth Blevan, and they later had a daughter named Margaret. The Ping family moved to Hardin in 1916 where J.J. opened a store. The store in Lodge Grass was later acquired as a branch. It was a clothing a mercantile operation. Ping owned the Lodge Grass store until 1954 when it was acquired by Howard and Barbara Mason.

INTEGRITY: Assess the degree to which the structure/site, and surrounding area accurately convey the historical associations of the property.

The site has excellent integrity. It is still in its original location, and looks much as it originally did. The building can convey, through its physical appearance, the stong impression of its historical associations. It has been operated as a store since its creation in 1920.

HISTORICAL and/or ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE: Justify how the persons, important events, or historical patterns associated with structure/site lend the property significance and/or describe the ways in which the structure embodies the distinctive characteristics of a particular period, building type, or style.

This building is associated with the lives of people who played a role in the history of Lodge Grass, and with the broad patterns of the historical development of the town. It was one of the first brick commercial structures built in Lodge Grass, of which only three still exist. Lodge Grass was proud of these buildings, bragging in a 1925 newspaper article that it "boasts of more substantial brick buildings than any town of its size in this part of the country" (The Searchlight (Hardin) 15 April 1925, p.1). This building is representative of a period (early Lodge Grass 1911-1921) and type (brick commerical structure) of which few others still stand in such good condition.

J.J. Ping, who owned this store for almost 30 years, was a well known Big Horn County merchant.

This site appears to be both architecturally and historically significant within the context of the Lodge Grass development.
