Narrative Description

The Baring Creek (Sun Camp) Fireguard Cabin was constructed with Public Works Project funds by local contractor Harry E. Doverspike in 1935. According to the final construction report, Plan NP/G3074 was used for this cabin as well as for fireguard cabins at Polebridge, Lake McDonald, Many Glacier, and Logging Creek, also constructed in 1935.

This structure is a single-room, single floor cabin, measuring 20x25', including an 11' front porch which is covered by the extended roof. The cabin has longitudinal purlins, 1" decking, cedar shingles, and log-on-log full-scribed walls with saddle-notched corners. There is a stone chimney at the rear of the cabin. This fireguard cabin was built according to cabin specifications provided by the Park Service's Division of Landscape Architecture. The only apparent dissimilarity is the center-wall placement of the entry. Other facsimiles of the plan are located within Glacier National Park in back-country locations and at other ranger stations. There is no indoor plumbing and heat is provided by a wood stove whose stovepipe exits through the back log wall to the stone chimney.

An outhouse is associated with the site but is not nominated as part of this listing.

Narrative Statement of Significance

The Baring Creek Fireguard Cabin is the sole remaining building of the Sun Camp Ranger Station complex of buildings, which at one time included a ranger station, barn, and woodshed located near the mouth of Baring Creek. The Going-to-the-Sun Ranger Station, Building #166, also known as Sun Camp Ranger Station, was built in 1928 to house a ranger close to the Going-to-the-Sun Chalet, or Sun Camp, which was located on Sun Point on St. Mary Lake. The personnel housed at this location were to provide services and protection to the visitors and resources near Sun Camp, including hikers and boaters. The Ranger Station was located about a mile west of the Chalet, just to the east of the mouth of Baring Creek near the shore of the lake. The Ranger Station was built before the Chalet could be accessed by road, as the Going-to-the-Sun Road was not opened until 1933. The Fireguard Cabin (Building #167) was added as a satellite to this complex in 1935. Having personnel stationed in the area was important, for communication and commuting time from the foot of the lake did not easily allow timely response to visitor and resource management needs.

The opening of the Going-to-the-Sun Road in 1933 lessened the management need for a ranger station in the area, but the Sun Camp Ranger Station continued to be staffed through 1941. During World War II, it was not regularly staffed. After the war, park visitation patterns had changed and the Going-to-the-Sun Chalet had fallen into disrepair. The Chalet was removed in 1948, but Glacier National Park continued to use the Ranger Station as quarters until the early 1960's. When adequate housing was developed at the foot of the lake, near the park boundary at St. Mary, the old Sun Camp Ranger Station was no longer needed and it was removed. The Fireguard Cabin began to be called "Baring Creek Cabin" and it is still used to house personnel as needed.
