#### DESCRIPTION

Located on one of the first ridges west of the Meadowlands and Palisades in northeastern New Jersey, the Borough of Glen Ridge is an overwhelmingly residential suburban community that was largely developed between 1870 and 1940. A 'wooded ravine cut by Taney's Brook bisects the community; it is paralleled by two commuter railroad lines and the major east/west street, Bloomfield Avenue. The borough's principal north/south thoroughfare, Ridgewood Avenue, runs perpendicularly to these features. A small civic and commercial center is located at the intersection of Bloomfield and Ridgewood Avenues, outside of which the community's tree-lined and gas lamp-lighted streets are fronted by detached, single-family dwellings.

The Glen Ridge Historic District occupies the central portion of the borough, encompassing the civic/commercial core and the surrounding residential areas which had been developed by the 1920s. Less than 3% of the District's buildings date from before 1870; about 5% postdate 1930. While frame construction predominates, brick and stone also were utilized. In terms of size and embellishment, the houses range from the small and modest to the large and elaborate. Most are quite substantial. Throughout the District, dwellings occupy landscaped lots of varying size whose mature trees and shrubs contribute much to the District's sylvan suburban atmosphere.

The District's architecture is representative of the late 19th and early 20th centuries and its housing stock includes examples of many of the styles popular during that era. Although present in the District, such Victorian styles as the Italianate and Second Empire are not widespread, not surprisingly since residential development did not begin in earnest until the 1880s and 1890s. The community's late 19th/early 20th century building boom was dominated first by the Queen Anne style and subsequently by the Colonial Revival. Other styles introduced at that time which also influenced the District's architecture in varying degrees include the Shingle, Tudor Revival, Mission, Spanish Colonial Revival, Prairie School and Craftsman modes. The Tudor Revival emerged as the most popular of these styles in the World War I era and thereafter was second only to the Colonial Revival in popularity in Glen Ridge.

The National Register nomination for the Glen Ridge Historic District was prepared in 1980, based on a 1978-79 historic sites survey of the borough. Rather tightly delineated at the time, the District's boundary excludes not only those portions of the community that were developed after 1930, but also several areas that had been built-up by the 1920s. In 1986, those portions of Glen Ridge outside of the District were re-evaluated as to their National Register eligibility and three areas were identified as appropriate additions to the District, two at its southern end and one on the north. The three proposed additions have a suburban residential character like that of the present District. Their tree-lined and gaslighted streets are fronted by single family dwellings, ranging in size from the modest to quite substantial, that exhibit mostly Colonial Revival and Tudor Revival stylistic influences and date, with few exceptions, from the 1920s and early 1930s. Architectural integrity is quite good, with only about 14% of the additions' 545 houses showing evidence of exterior alterations, which in large part are limited to the application of synthetic siding. Only 36 of the additions' 546 buildings (less than 7% of them) can be categorized as non-contributing, nearly all of which are infill dwellings built since World War II.

The additions have been inventoried as part of this description. In the inventory, the streets are arranged alphabetically by addition. Each listing has two numbers. The inner number is the street address of each building, which is used on the District map, while the identification number in the margin is used in the text and on the photo labels. For example, N:35 identifies the thirty-fifth house in the North Addition.

The larger of the two proposed additions in southern Glen Ridge encompasses the area around Hawthorne and Midland Avenues, north of Carteret Street. It contains 202 dwellings, modest, mostly frame structures that are rather closely spaced on small lots with fairly short setbacks from the street. On Hawthorne Avenue, both the houses and the lots are somewhat larger than elsewhere in the Addition. The vast majority of the dwellings date to the 1920s or early 1930s and are of Colonial or Tudor Revival derivation. There are, however, a few houses of earlier and later date; Craftsman style influences also are evident. Five houses are non-contributing, three of which were built after World War II. The Carteret Street Playground is also located in the Southeast Addition.

The Colonial Revival houses of the Southeast Addition typify the more informal, vernacular aspects of America's architectural heritage that became popular in the second decade of this century. They are boxy, simply detailed, 1½ or 2-story structures, often with shed dormers, vestibules or entry porches, side porches, and wood shingle, brick, or clapboard siding. Classically derived ornament is usually confined to the detailing of the entries and porches, for which fanlights, pediments, and Tuscan columns commonly were employed. The Dutch Colonial gambrel-roofed variant of the style is quite prevalent; less common is the Garrison Colonial which is distinguished by a second story front overhang with pendants. Representative Colonial Revival houses include 34 Lorraine Street (SE:162), a clapboard-clad house with Tuscan-columned porch, and 73 Hawthorne Avenue (SE:78), whose end-bay entry has a glass enclosed stoop with elliptical United States Department of the Interior National Park Service

fanlight and triangular pediment, a group of five gambrel-roofed Dutch Colonial houses on the east side of Hawthorne Avenue (SE:73 - 77), and 14 Lorraine Street (SE:125), a Garrison Colonial with pendanted overhang.

Other dwellings in the Southeast Addition reveal the influence of Tudor Revival style interpretations of English cottage architecture. While often not unlike their Colonial Revival neighbors in their boxy, gable-roofed forms and vestibules and porches, they are somewhat more exuberantly detailed with a "picturesque" mix of materials. Typical features include decorative half-timbering, cross gables, prominent chimneys that often combine brick with stone, and round-headed or Tudor-arched entries. Among the representative examples are 56, 80 & 84 Hawthorne Avenue (SE:91, 97 & 98) all of which have prominent front gables and chimneys, and 18 and 35 Madison Street (SE:155 & 150) which have a combination of clapboard siding with half-timbered stucco. Craftsman style influences, such as overhanging eaves with exposed rafter ends, are found on a number of houses. Good examples include a group of six houses on Midland Avenue (SE:191 through SE:196).

The much smaller Southwest Addition to the Historic District is an appendage extending south of Washington Street along Spencer Road and a short portion of Linden Avenue. Of its nineteen houses, only one is non-contributing, a c. 1950 infill dwelling (SW:12). The oldest house in the Addition, 300 Linden Avenue (SW:3), is a Craftsman style bungalow dating c. 1915. The others are Colonial or Tudor Revival structures that were built in the late 1920s, except for two erected in the 1930s. They are larger and somewhat more elaborately detailed than the dwellings in the southeast addition. Of individual note are 285 Linden Avenue (SW:2), a stucco-clad, "English Cottage" enlivened by half-timbering and clapboarding at the gable peaks, hip and gable dormers, and multi-pane casement windows and 279 Linden Avenue (SW:1). a large "Garrison Colonial" with pendanted overhang, clapboard siding above the brick first story, a central entry, and a glass-enclosed side porch.

The largest of the additions to the Historic District stretches northward from Bay Avenue almost to the Glen Ridge Country Club. It contains 324 houses, the majority of which are Colonial or Tudor Revival style dwellings erected in the 1920s and 1930s. In general, they are quite substantial structures sited on large landscaped lots. The largest and most elaborate houses are concentrated on Ridgewood Avenue. More modest dwellings, like those of the Southwest Addition, are present on several side streets such as Mitchell Place, Roswell Terrace, and Bay Avenue. Slightly more than one dozen earlier 20th century dwellings are located in the southwestern part of the Addition on Ridgewood Avenue, Oxford United States Department of the Interior National Park Service

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Street, and Bay Avenue. One house on Innes Place (N:164) is a late 19th century, Queen Anne outbuilding, the only surviving element of a large estate and now converted into a single family residence. One non-residential building is present, the Forest Avenue School (N:158), an asymmetrically massed Tudor Revival structure built in 1929. There are thirty non-contributing buildings in the Addition, just over half of which are post-World War II infill dwellings. Most of the latter are located on Ridgewood Avenue and many of them harmonize quite well with their earlier neighbors.

The more informal, vernacular Colonial Revival style was widely employed for both modest and more substantial houses of the North Addition. Among the representative examples are 232 Forest Avenue (N:111), a shingle-clad structure with sidelighted entry and gabled stoop, 2 Innes Place (N:165), a clapboarded dwelling whose end-bay entry has a bracketed hood, 213 Forest Avenue (N:67), a  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story house with shed dormers and recessed front porch, 485 Ridgewood Avenue (N:225), an L-shaped, shingle-clad dwelling with a stone vestibule, and 493 Ridgewood Avenue (N:228), a  $l_2^1$ -story brick house with gable wall dormers. Many gambrel-roofed Dutch Colonial houses are present including 211 Forest Avenue (N:66), 7 Ardsley Road (N:3), 17 and 21 Cambridge Road (N:24 & 25) and 9 Mitchell Place (N:174). There are fewer Garrison Colonials; 224 Forest Avenue (N:106) is an example. Many of the large and elaborate Colonial Revival houses in the North Addition exhibit more formal Georgian influences. Good examples include 443 Ridgewood Avenue (N:215), a brick dwelling with a pedimented, 2-story portico, side-lighted central entry with elliptical fanlight, and corner quoins, and 431 Ridgewood Avenue (N:213), a frame structure whose central entry bay, articulated as a pavilion, has full-height pilasters supporting a triangular pediment.

While the North Addition has some modest "English cottages" like those of the southern additions, its Tudor Revival houses are generally quite substantial and often quite elaborately detailed with a picturesque combination of materials and motifs. Among the smaller, simpler houses are 19 and 21 Mitchell Place (N:178 & 179) and 36 Stanford Place (N:301). Many of the larger Tudor Revival houses, such as 255 Forest Avenue (N:84) are not much differently detailed than their smaller neighbors. A substantial number, however, are more strikingly elaborately embellished. Good examples include 428 Ridgewood Avenue (N:248) whose front is dominated by gabled-projections and massive stone and brick chimneys with corbelled pots and 495 Ridgewood Avenue (N:229) which has a round, conical-roofed tower whose recessed entry has a stone surround.

# 8. Significance

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Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

#### SIGNIFICANCE

The Glen Ridge Historic District, to quote the 1980 National Register nomination, is significant as "an important example of the evolution of a suburban community in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The attitudes of its founding fathers towards community design and growth, which were physically realized, are a clear expression of progressive planning ideas of the time. The buildings of the district encompass a representative cross section of the many architectural styles popular during the period. Lined for the most part by well-preserved and relatively unaltered single family dwellings, the tree-shaded of the Historic District retain much gas-lit streets of their and turn-of-the-century appearance".

In terms of architectural character and development pattern, the three additions are compatible with the Glen Ridge District. The development of the northern and southern ends of the borough conforms to the physical pattern and "progressive" planning principals firmly established in the community early in this century. Largely built-up in the post World War I era, the three additions have a suburban residential character like that of the district with tree-lined and gas-lighted streets fronted by detached, single family, revival style dwellings that range from the modest to the quite substantial.

The additions' houses illustrate the evolution of the community's domestic architecture in the years between the two world wars. The vast majority of them date to the 1920s and early 1930s and exhibit Colonial Revival or Tudor Revival influences. Both of these styles appeared in Glen Ridge before 1900 and in the post-World War I era came to dominate residential construction. Whereas the earlier Colonial Revival houses of Glen Ridge had typically been derived from Georgian prototypes, those of the additions are largely based on the more informal, vernacular 18th century architecture of eastern America. While interpretations of the Tudor Revival style were fairly limited and restrained in Glen Ridge around 1900, exuberantly detailed Tudor Revival houses proliferate in the additions.

The physical character of the additions continues the development pattern introduced into Glen Ridge by late 19th century developers and builders, and codified by the subsequent actions of the newly established borough government. The Borough of Glen Ridge was created from the western part of Bloomfield Township in 1895 through the efforts of residents unhappy with the government of Bloomfield and the lack of municipal services in their neighborhood. Both the new municipal government and early civic leaders acted to provide progressive

civic improvements and to protect and enhance residential property values. They also sought to preserve the pastoral character of the community, its original attraction for urban emigrants, and to ensure its continued development as a garden suburb. Derelict mill properties along Taney's Brook were purchased to protect them from commercial development, leading eventually to the preservation of the entire ravine as a park. All streets were paved after gas, sewer, and water lines had been laid; street trees were planted in ample curb strips between the sidewalks and the pavement.

In the vanguard of New Jersey communities to engage in progressive planning, Glen Ridge commissioned a professional planning study in 1909, adopted a building code and established a building department in 1910, and enacted a zoning ordinance in 1921. As recommended in the 1909 study, a municipal center was created at the intersection of Bloomfield and Ridgewood Avenues, telephone and electric lines were buried where feasible or run along rear property lines, and the existing pattern of curb strip with trees was continued along newly opened streets. Land use was regulated and standards set for minimum lot size, maximum lot coverage, and building set backs. Commercial activity was limited to the immediate environs of the civic center. The community's few small scattered industries were eliminated, since almost the entire community was zoned for single family dwellings. These patterns and policies shaped the development of the northern and southern ends of Glen Ridge in the decades after World War I, ensuring that these new neighborhoods conformed to the community's historic suburban image.

Verbal Boundary Description and Justification for Proposed Additions to the Glen Ridge Historic District

#### North Addition

Starting at the south corner of lot 26 of block 115, which point is on both the north side of Bay Avenue, and the north boundary of the existing Historic District, the boundary line of "the North Addition to the Glen Ridge Historic District runs in a northerly direction, along the west side of lots 26, 27, 12, 28, 14, 17, 3, 3A, and 29, all of block 115, to the middle of Cambridge Road. The line then jogs northwest, along the middle of Cambridge Road, to a point opposite the southern corner of lot 30 of block 119. It then turns northeast, and runs along the west side of lots 30, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, and 9, all of block 119, crosses Avon Place in a straight line, and continues northeast along the rear of lots 3, 32, 6, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, and 22, all of block 122, to Glen Ridge Parkway. The line proceeds northeastward, to the center of Glen Ridge Parkway, and then runs southeast to the intersection of Glen Ridge Parkway and Stonehouse Road. From here, the line turns northeast again, to run along the western side of lot 34 of block 134, to the northeast corner of this lot. Turning northwest, the boundary runs along the north side of lot 34, to the northwestern corner, and out to the middle of Forest Avenue.

The boundary runs north along the center of Forest Avenue, to the intersection of Forest and Sunset Avenues. From here, the line turns west, to run along the center of Sunset Avenue, to the intersection of Sunset and Ridgewood Avenues. Next, the line turns north, to run along the center of Ridgewood Avenue, to the intersection of Ridgewood Avenue and Stephen Street. The boundary run west up the center of Stephen Street, to a point opposite the south corner of lot 3, of block 130. Here, it turns north and runs along the eastern side of lot 3, to the northeast corner of this lot, where it turns west to run along the rear of lots 3 and 2, to the northwest corner of lot 2. The line turns and runs south to the southwest corner of lot 2, of block 130, and crosses Stephen Street in a straight line to the northeast corner of lot 7, of block 131. It runs along the northern side of lot 7, to the northwestern corner of the lot, and then runs down the western side to the southwest corner, which point is on the northern side of lot The line turns west, to run along the rear of lot 13 to its northwest 13. corner, and then turns south.

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From the southwest corner of lot 13, the boundary line crosses Dodd Street in a straight line to the northeast corner of lot 1, of block 117. The line runs west, to the northwest corner of the lot, and then turns south. At the southwest corner of lot 1, which point is also on the northern side of lot 26, the line turns west, and runs along the rear of lots 26 and 25. It turns south at the northwestern corner of lot 25, and runs along the lot's western side, crosses Ferncliff Terrace in a straight line, and continues south along the west side of lot 23, of block 118. At the southwest corner of lot 23, which is on the north side of lot 12, the boundary travels west, along the north side of lots 12 and 11, to the northwest corner of lot 11. It turns south, running along the west side of lot 11, and crosses Stanford Place in a straight line to a point on the north side of lot 10, of block 127. It turns west, along the north side of lot 10, and turns south at the lot's northwest corner. At the southwest corner of the lot, which is on the north side of lot 9A, the line turns west, and runs to the northwest corner of lot 9A. From here, it runs south along the west side of the lot, crosses Glen Ridge Parkway in a straight line, and continues south along the west side of lot 11, of block 125.

From the southwest corner of lot 11, which is on the north side of lot 2, of block 125, the boundary travels west, along the rear of lots 2 and 1, to the northwest corner of lot 1. Then it runs south, along the west side of the lot and crosses Columbus Avenue in a straight line, to a point on the north side of lot 14, of block 123, directly opposite the southwest corner of lot 1, block 125. The line travels west to the northwest corner of lot 14, and turns south, to run to the southwest corner of the lot. It takes a brief jog east, to the north corner of lot 13, and then follows the rear of lots 13, 12, 11, 10, and 9, to the southwest corner of lot 9. The line turns east, and runs along the south side of lot 9, to the northwest corner of lot 3. It turns south, along the west side of lot 3, and continues to a point in the center of Ardsley Road.

The boundary line jogs northwest, along the center of Ardsley Road, to a point opposite the north corner of lot 9, of block 114. From this point, the line turns south, to run along the western side of lots 9 and 1, to the southwest corner of lot 1. It continues to the center of Tuxedo Road, and then jogs southeast to a point opposite the northwest corner of lot 10, of block 113. The line turns south, to the north corner of lot 10, and continues along the western side of that lot. At the southwest corner of lot 10, which is on the north side of lot 11, the line briefly jogs west, to the northwest corner of lot 11. The line turns south to follow the western side of lot 11, crosses Cambridge Road in a straight line, and continues along the western side of lot 12, of block 111. At the southwest corner of lot 12, it jogs west, to the northwest corner of

lot 1. The boundary turns south and runs along the west side of lot 1, to the southwest corner of the lot.

From the southwest corner of lot 1, the boundary line travels to the center of Oxford Street, and runs east to a point opposite the northwest corner of lot 11, block 108. It turns south, to follow the western side of lot 11, to the southwest corner of the lot. Next, the line runs southeast, along the rear of lots 11 and 20, to the corner of lot 28. From here, it runs south along the western side of lot 28, to the corner of lot 14A, where the line turns northwest. It then travels along the north side of lot 14A, to the northwest corner of the lot, and then turns south to the southwest corner of the lot, which point is on the north side of Innes place. The line follows the south side of lot 14A to a point opposite the northwest corner of lot 31, of block 107. From this point, the boundary line crosses Innes Place in a straight line, and travels along the west side of lot 31, to the southwest corner of the lot, which point is also the northeast corner of lot 29. It turns west, running along the north side of lot 29, to the northwest corner of the lot, where the line turns south, and continues the center of Roswell Terrace.

The boundary line travels east down the center of Roswell Terrace, to a point opposite the northwest corner of lot 34, of block 106. It turns south, to follow the western side of lot 34, to the southwest corner of the lot. It then turns east to the southeast corner of the lot, which point is also the northwest corner of lot 40. From here, the line runs south, along the western side of lot 40, and continues out to the center of Bay Avenue. The line turns east and travels down the center of Bay Avenue, to the intersection of Bay and Sherman Avenues, which point is a corner of the north boundary of the existing Historic District. The boundary for the addition continues down the center of Bay Avenue, following the District's northern boundary, to a point opposite the south corner of lot 26, of block 115, which is the point of beginning.

On the west side of the proposed North Addition, the boundary follows a line of convenience along the municipal boundary, but jogs to conform with lot lines. The Mountainside Hospital complex on Bay Avenue was excluded, as it had been from the original district. The eastern boundary of the proposed Addition runs along the rear lot lines of the house on the east side of Forest Avenue to exclude the non-contributing and altered dwellings on Stonehouse Road. At the north end the large property of the Glen Ridge Country Club provides a clear break in the borough's townscape. In addition, the clubhouse itself has suffered a decided architectural integrity. North of it and Stephen Street. loss of non-contributing and altered houses predominate, as is the case around Sunset

Avenue, just south of the Club. The northern boundary was drawn in recognition of these factors.

#### Southeast Addition

Starting in the middle of Ridgewood Avenue, on the southern boundary of the existing Historic District, at a point opposite the north corner of lot 10, of block 13, the boundary line for the Southeast Addition to the Glen Ridge Historic District runs southerly down the center of Ridgewood Avenue to the intersection of Ridgewood Avenue and Carteret Street. Turning southeast, it travels the center of Carteret Street to a point opposite the northeast corner of lot 34, of block 14. The line turns southwest, and follows the northwest side of lot 34, to the west corner of the lot. Here, it turns southeast along the rear of lots 34 and 14, to the south corner of lot 14. It travels northeast along the eastern side of lot 14, to the southwest corner of lot 8. Next, the line turns southeast, to run along the rear of lots 8, 6, 3A, 3B, crosses Hawthorne Avenue, and continues along the rear of lots 9, 10, 11, 11A, 15, and 13.

From the south corner of lot 13, the boundary travels northeast along the eastern side of lot 13, and continues to the center of Carteret Street. It travels down the center of Carteret Street to a point opposite the south corner of lot 6, of block 29. Here, it turns northeast, running along the southeast side of lot 6, to the east corner of the lot, which is on the southwest side of lot 22. The line takes a short jog southeast, to the south corner of lot 22, and then turns northeast. It runs along the eastern side of lot 22, crosses Brighton Avenue, continues along the eastern side of lots 23 and 32, of block 26, crosses Coolidge Avenue, and travels along the eastern side of lot 33, of block 34. The line takes a very short jog northwest to the south corner of lot 3, and then runs along the rear of lots 3, 5, 9, 7, 6, 4, 2, and 1, all of block 34.

At the east corner of lot 1, the line turns northwest, along the northern side of lot 1, and continues across Midland Avenue and down the center of Adams Place, to a point opposite the south corner of lot 17, of block 22. From here, the line travels northeast, along the eastern side of lot 17, to the east corner of the lot. This point is on the boundary of the existing Historic District. The boundary for the Addition follows the existing District's boundary west and south to the point of beginning.

While the proposed Southeast Addition extends eastward to the borough line, on the north its boundary jogs to exclude a group of 1950s houses on Adams and Astor Places. Similarly, Carteret Street forms the southern boundary of the

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addition to avoid a row of non-contributing dwellings opposite the Barrows Field playground and the large area of post-1935 development around lower Hawthorne Avenue. A high incidence of alterations led to the exclusion of Midland Avenue, south of Carteret Street. Pronounced integrity problems and the presence of many non-contributing dwellings also removed the southwestern corner of Glen Ridge, the Willow Street neighborhood, from consideration as part of the district's southeastern extension. An additional factor was the small scale and tight spacing of the houses on Ridgewood Avenue below Cross Street. To the north, throughout the district, Ridgewood Avenue is fronted mostly by very substantial houses on large lots, as befits it role as the community's widest and most important thoroughfare.

#### Southwest Addition

Starting at a point in the intersection of Douglas Road and Washington Street, which point is also a southwest corner of the Glen Ridge Historic District, the boundary line for the Southwest Addition briefly jogs northwest to a point opposite the eastern side of Alden Road. The line turns southwest, along the eastern side of Alden Road, and the western side of lot 17, of block 25, to the southwest corner of lot 17. It then turns east, running along the rear of lots 17, and 16, to the northwest corner of lot 18. Here, the line travels southwest, along the rear of lots 18, 12, 13, 19, 11, 9, 20, and 21, and continues out to the center of Linden Avenue.

The boundary line takes a short jog northwest, to a point opposite the north corner of lot 37, of block 16, and then turns southwest to follow the western side of lot 37. At the west corner of lot 37, the line turns southeast, along the rear of the lot, to the east corner. It turns northeast, traveling along the eastern side of lot 37, and continues out to the center of Linden Avenue.

The line travels southeast down the center of Linden Avenue to a point opposite the south corner of lot 12, of block 33. Turning northeast, it follows the southeast side of lot 12 to the east corner of the lot. Next, the boundary travels northwest, along the northeast side of lots 12, and 38, to the north corner of lot 38. Taking a brief jog southwest to the east corner of lot 1, the line then turns northwest, to run along the northeast side of lot 1, and continues out to the center of Spencer Road. Turning northeast, it travels down the center of Spencer Road to a point opposite the west corner of lot 8, of block 33. The line turns southeast, and runs along the southwestern side of lot 8 to the south corner of the lot. It then turns northeast, along the rear of lot 8, to where it joins the boundary of the existing district. The boundary for the

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Addition continues northeast, following the District's boundary, to the middle of Washington Street. It then runs west, still following the existing District boundary, to the point of beginning.

The boundary of the Southwest Addition was drawn to exclude the non-contributing houses found on Evergreen Court, on the south side of Linden Avenue, and on Chestnut Hill Place. The excluded dwellings are mostly ranches, Cape Cods, and split-levels dating from the 1950s.
