

- 4. Owner: Herman Sena, 320 Grant, Las Vegas, N.M.
- 7. Description: L-shape plan; stuccoed foundation; stuccoed adobe walls; corrugated metal roof; small eaves; wood shingles and door in front gable, window in side gable; 1/1 double-hung and wood casement windows with wood surrounds; three single doors (main porch), one door secondary porch; porch posts with folk cut-out brackets painted blue. Located in a residential area, second house south of #1639. See previous sheet for discussion of area.
- 8. Significance: One of the best representatives of the New Mexico Vernacular tradition remaining on the hill northwest of the heart of Old Town, discussed in the previous entry. The core of the house (seen in ill. 64) probably dates to the development of this area between 1867 and 1882. Three rooms, each with its own door, step with the slope of the land in the traditional manner. Piecemeal additions continued to the side and rear until about 1930 (judging by the wood casement windows in the latest portions). The folk porch brackets, white wood trim with blue accents, dark brown gable shingles and shiney metal roof combine simple materials in an attractive way.
