

At one time, the room in the western section with the large fireplace referred to in DeCou's Historic Rancocas was divided into kitchen and dining room. A beehive oven was outside the fireplace projecting out to the exterior. The hall had a winding stairway where the present stairway is, The present broad broad hall has an open staircase with landing. The restoration of the present dining room (the east room) includes a mantel, paneling and carved chair rail taken from a house in Mount Holly, believed to be one of the oldest in town. It was owned by Miss Ann Burr. The open cupboard in the upstairs hall also came from Ann Burr's house.
