of the windows remain the same. Many of the large estates in Anchorage contained carriage houses and stables, some dating from the late nineteenth century. These utilitarian structures were built in styles which complemented the architecture of Anchorage residences and, during this period, the Shingle style was a popular style. The Sherley carriage house (JF664) was built in the 1890s and it also exhibits elements of the Shingle style. The Twin Gates and Sherley carriage houses are the best remaining examples of this type of late nineteenth-century structure in Anchorage.

Boundary Description

The boundary of the Twin Gates Carriage house site comprises Lot 465 in County Block 23, and contains 4.5 acres. There are no significant outbuildings.
