
19. History (continued): The Dominican sisters in the United States were first settled at a site several miles to the south, known as St Rose Farm., in 1823. An academy was conducted by the sisters from 1823 to 1851, known as St Magdalen Academy. In the 1830s a large convent and school were built. Additions, including a Gothic chapel in 1847. In 1851 the name of the convent and Academy was changed to St. Catherine of Sienna In the early 1890s a new and much larger convent and school was built on the same site but was destroyed by firein the early 20th century, and the entire complex then relocated to the present site on the Bardstown Road. It is the motherhouse of the American order.

The other structures on the site include Bertrand Hall, an addition to the Academy portion of the motherhouse building, 1938, Sahsbury Infirmary, 1961, Lourdes Hall, a building to house the college, 1965, Lourdes Hall includes a gymnasium, offices, and classrooms.
