NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

The house at 60 William Street is an important local example of the Italian villa style as it was miniaturized for smaller dwellings and therefore meets Criterion C of the National Register of Historic Places.

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This L-plan Italianate residence is designed in the "Tuscan villa" mode of the mid-nineteenth century. It is a type usually associated with more elaborate examples than this modest residence. Popularized by the publications of A.J. Downing, the Italian villa was considered appropriate for the scenic rural landscape. Built on a bluff overlooking the Charles River, early occupants of the house no doubt enjoyed picturesque views from the house's three-story tower. The tower is located at the intersection of the building's two wings, and has round-headed windows in the upper story. The gable-roofed wings have deep cornices and returns characteristic of early Italianate houses.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

In 1855 Stephen Perry, who lived nearby at the intersection of William and Galen Streets in Watertown, owned this house and a number of others in the vicinity. C.O. Lummus, a carpenter with a shop on Centre Street, occupied the house in 1874.

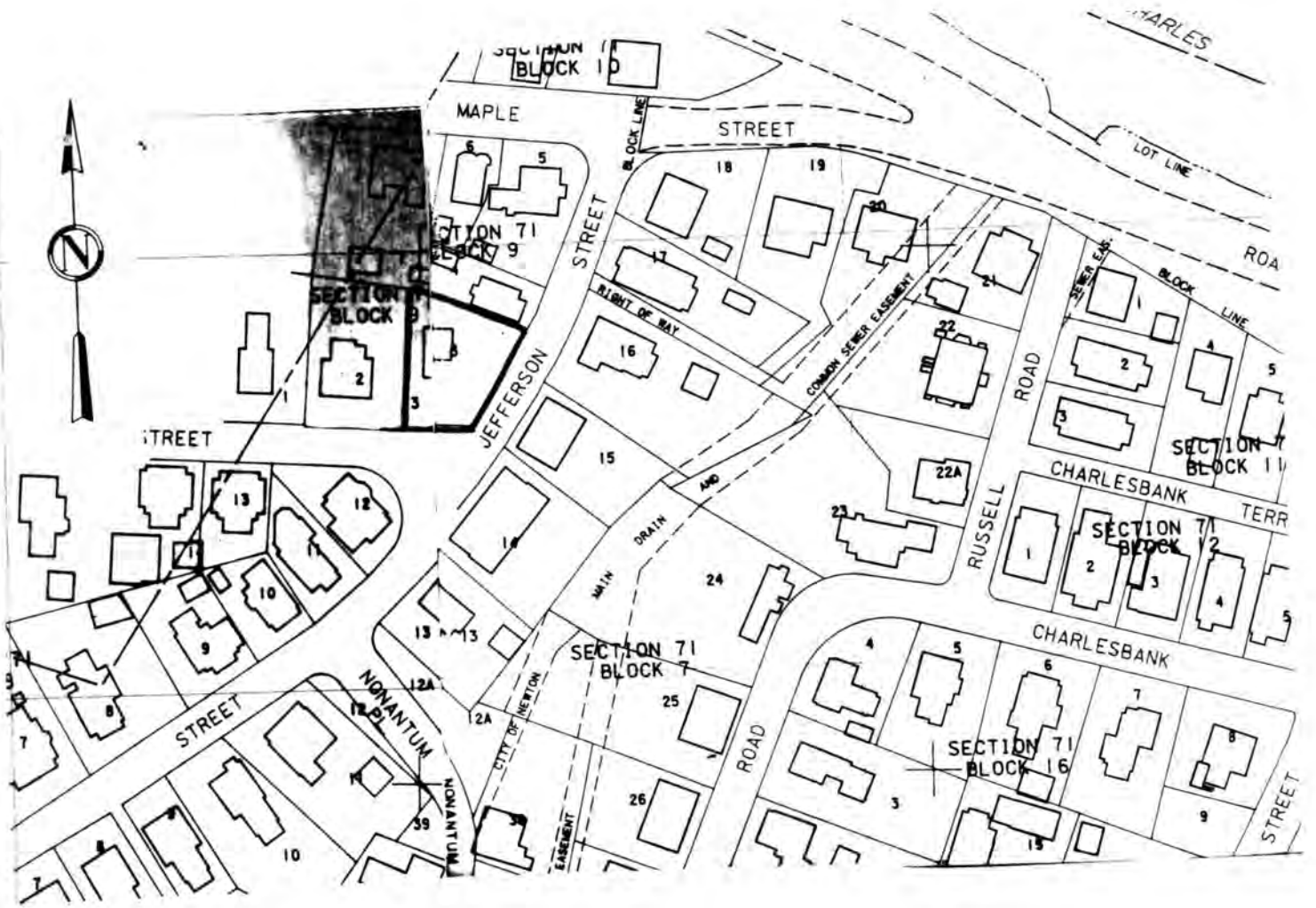
