

18. Description The Shirley mansion was built as an Italianate structure of red brick in about 1865. The porches, porte cochère, and crenelated tower have a classical and Tudor air and were all additions. 19. History This house was built for Edward Hobb's daughter, Susan, upon her marriage to John C. Sherley in December 1865. The large porches and tower were added in the 1890's for the occasion of the wedding of their daughter Nanine. The work was done by Wm. B. Wood, builder of many structures in the area.
