20. Significance <u>Apparently built by Milton Holiday, this was originally a log dogtrot structure. The house was sheathed by an early owner who had an exuberant and provincial knowledge of the Greek Revival style. Whimsical details include oversized moldings, Greek keys on the corner pilasters, and a series of guttae on the cornice rather than the more standard use of dentals.</u>		Picture No. _____
