SIGNIFICANCE:

Built for Joseph Bardsley, this architecturally exuberant structure is one of the most prominent residences in the area. The sprawling lawns and elegant carriage house reinforce its prominent position. Moreover, it was featured in the July 1900 issue of <u>Scientific American, Building Edition</u>. The residence was described as having "...excellent proportions, good detail, and attractive features...". Photographs of the house and scale drawings of first floor stairway and arch details were published.

Christopher Myers, a long-time resident of the community, was the architect for the <u>Scientific American Building Edition</u>. Many of his Montclair residences were featured in this important publication.

This elegant, well-preserved residence is possibly the finest example of the architect's work in the town.
