

Two-story frame wing on rear. A one-room, one-story stone structure is connected to the main log house by a frame dog trot. House is entered from the dogtrot which has 6/6 pane windows. 19. History In 1795 Daniel McClure purchased 596 acres of the William Fleming Preemption of 1000 acres. He sold off a 101 acre tract which had several owners before James Boston purchased it in 1810. Boston owned it until 1831 and it might have been during this time that the house was built. Abraham L. Frame garage added off east end of stone section. Stone springhouse south of house.

he lived there. Williams sold it to John Herr, Jr. (1806-1863) (JF-490 National Register 1978) who left it in his will to his son Henry C. Herr.

The farm is associated with Peter Nachand who purchased it with Lorenz Steinmetz in 1864. Nachand's daughter and son-in-law John and Annie Lenz lived there from 1908 to 1928.

end chimneys, a one-story porch across front and small windows under the eaves. The house has a wood shingle roof.

Although the original builder is not known, the property was owned by James Boston from 1810 to 1831. Abraham L. Williams who later built an elegant home (JF-513) lived there in the 1840s. Peter Nachand was owner in the last half of the 19th century.

This is an important example of an early log structure in the county. The early stone cabin which has been connected to the log house, and the stone springhouse make an interesting complex.

Boundary Description

The boundaries of the nominated site are the perimeter of the main house and the perimeter of the springhouse. Both are shown as red lines on the attached aerial photography (SCALE: 1" = 200').

Boundary description:

The site includes the entirety of Lot 46, Block W-1, as recorded in the office of the Property Valuation Administrator of Jefferson County, Kentucky.

Boundary justification:

There are two historic improvements on the tract; a main house and springhouse. The boundary reflects the spatial and functional relationship between the dwelling and its dependency and their historic arrangement on the land. Furthermore, the boundary identifies the relationship between the farm and the significant historic road route which borders it, the Louisville-Westport Road.
