

45. Description and House Plan:

The Tates Creek Baptist Church is a one-story rectangular church sanctuary with the entrance in the gable end. The front facade is divided into five bays by brick pilasters. A wide cornice defines the eaves on all facades. The side bays are divided into four bays with paired elongated windows which are four over four. Windows are in three of the bays. Windows have been bricked in on the two-bay rear, or north, facade. The front facade has been modified with the division of the windows and foreshortening of the central door. Access to the basement has been created on the west side.



Statement of Significance

The Tates Creek Baptist Church is significant under criterion C for circa 1851 as an example of how Madison County builders used some details such as pilasters and low-pitched gable roofs in combination with earlier building techniques such as jack arches to ornament a rural brick church building.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen arbitraily to preserve the building's setback from the road (KY 627) and to provide a minimal setting for the building.

The boundary contains one contributing building.

14. History

Tates Creek Baptist Church was organized by John Tanner, a minister from Boones Creek Church in Athens, Fayette County, in 1783. In the early nineteenth century, Madison County Baptists were split into two groups; the Regular Baptists emphasized organization. They wanted educated ministers to perform rituals and discouraged the emotionalism of frontier religions. The Separate Baptists preferred local control and allowed untrained men to preach and perform the rituals. They were emotional in worship and shared religious experiences in which they saw the "light." These differences were accentuated in the Tates Creek congregation with the visit of Alexander Campbell to Richmond in 1824. The church split and, when the church building burned, the land on which it stood was sold and the money divided between the two groups. The Regular Baptists rebuilt on the Boonesborough Road in 1851. The church was named the Tates Creek Church of United Baptist.
