DESCRIPTION:

The Muret N. Leland House is located on a wooded lot in Wells. The $2\frac{1}{2}$ story Queen Anne house of irregular plan has a multiple gable roof and is constructed of clapboard on a limestone foundation. A conical-roofed turret eminates from the second floor, and side and front porches feature a pedimented roof. A porte-cochere with a pyramidal roof, finial, turned posts, bracketted eaves, and spandrels is attached to the front porch. Ornamentation includes shingled turret and gables with multi-paned windows, second story spandrelled porch, and decorated barge boards. Roof cresting and chimney caps have been removed. Other minor alterations have included removal of balustrades from the front porch and enclosing of the side porch. The interior of the house retains many original furnishings. Future plans included the total restoration of the building.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The Muret N. Leland House is significant for its association with pioneer merchant Muret Leland, and as one of the most imposing residences in Wells, one of the larger Faribault County railroad townsites platted in the late 19th century. Leland was born in Michigan in 1849 and moved to Wells in 1870, one year after the village was platted. He established one of the larger general mercantile businesses in Wells and operated it until his retirement in 1903. Politically active, Leland served as mayor of Wells, school board official and representative in the State Legislature. Although little is known of Watson, the house's builder, locally it is known as the Leland house since its purchase by Leland in 1890. The house incorporates many features of the Queen Anne style and reflects the commercial, social, and political prominence that a pioneer businessman achieved in the community of Wells.
