### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Thomas C. Galloway Residence is a two story brick house in late Queen Anne style, going Colonial. It is distinguished by a central five-sided dormer with an octagonal peak.

A Doric columned, balustraded porch runs the length of the west facade. A two story bay at the south corner forms a mock tower with its peaked roof. All the first story openings on the west side are graced by fine beveled leaded glass transoms, as is the north side's bay window. The centered oak front door has an oval etched window.

On the south side of the house a centered side entry porch repeats the front porch's motif and supports a second story sleeping porch.

The interior woodwork remains in good condition.

A pair of dormers break the roof line on both the north and south sides.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Thomas C. Galloway residence is significant because it is one of the most pretentious dwellings in Weiser of the period. When constructed in 1900 for \$5-6,000, it was the most expensive house in town. The style reflects the period's tastes and the scale symbolizes Thomas Galloway's faith in Weiser and his standing in the community. The interior woodwork and leaded glass windows are representative of the craftsmanship of the period.

Thomas C. Galloway was the original settler in the Weiser Valley. He came to Idaho in 1863, bringing an early sawmill to the Boise Basin gold fields. In September, 1863, he erected a pioneer log cabin in the Weiser valley, maintaining a hotel and express office. In 1865 he replaced this crude structure with the first frame building in what was to become Weiser. He remained active in the community's social and political affairs, twice serving as a senator in the territorial legislature and as a representative after statehood. He lived in this house until his death and it was only in the past few years that the dwelling passed out of the Galloway family's hands.
