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45. Description and House Plan:

The Warnock House is a two story, three bay, weatherboarded house designed on the T-plan. It has a steeply pitched gable roof with decorative trusses in the apex of the gables. The wide overhanging eaves are slightly flared. The front facade features a steeply pitched cross gable. The elongated, double windows have horizontal and vertical banding around them for emphasis. The porch is one story with a shed roof which has elongated triangular brackets filled with sawn foliate scrollwork. There is also sawn vertical work in the gables.

and structures associated with the domestic space of the Warnock House.

On both the side and front porches, the original wood floor has been replaced by a concrete slab and covered in astro-turf. There are two outbuildings. On the south is a one room, square frame building with a gable roof and windows in the gable end. The square frame building was used as servants' quarters in the late nineteenth century.

To the north and west of the house is a rectangular building which has aluminum siding on it and is used as a garage. It was built relatively recently and is non-contributing.
