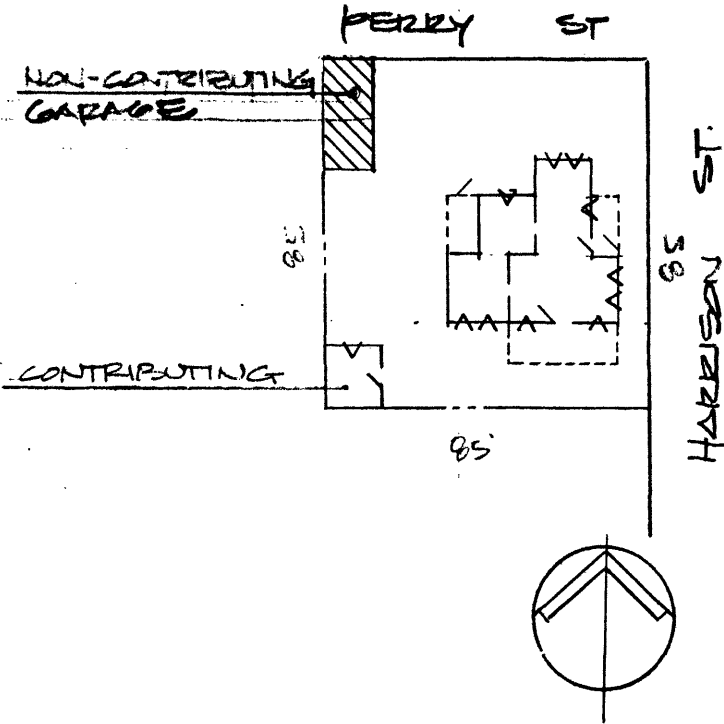

Starting at a point in the southwest corner of the intersection of Harrison and Perry Streets; then south 85 feet south along the west side of Harrison St. to the SE corner of the lot of 404 Harrison; then west 85 feet along the south property line to the SW corner of 404 Harrison St.; then north 85 feet along the west property line of 404 Harrison to the NW corner; then east along the south side of Perry Street 85 feet to the NE corner of 404 Harrison.

The boundary contains two contributing buildings and one non-contributing structure and contains all the buildings and structures associated with the domestic space of the Warnock House.

45. Description and House Plan:

The Warnock House is a two story, three bay, weatherboarded house designed on the T-plan. It has a steeply pitched gable roof with decorative trusses in the apex of the gables. The wide overhanging eaves are slightly flared. The front facade features a steeply pitched cross gable. The elongated, double windows have horizontal and vertical banding around them for emphasis. The porch is one story with a shed roof which has elongated triangular brackets filled with sawn foliate scrollwork. There is also sawn vertical work in the gables.

On both the side and front porches, the original wood floor has been replaced by a concrete slab and covered in astro-turf. There are two outbuildings. On the south is a one room, square frame building with a gable roof and windows in the gable end. The square frame building was used as servants' quarters in the late nineteenth century.

To the north and west of the house is a rectangular building which has aluminum siding on it and is used as a garage. It was built relatively recently and is non-contributing.

The Warnock House is significant under Criterion C as Greenup's most outstanding example of the stick style. It has retained the salient features of the style in its high pitched roof, flared eaves, cross-bracing, cross-braces, and wall treatment. [C]

14. History: The house was built by Basil Warnock in the late nineteenth century. According to Biggs, Warnock owned the first automobile in Greenup County.
