

18. Description A one and one-half story square block of brick construction situated off State Highway 1492. The facade consists of four bays accented by a pedimented entrance pavilion which incorporates the two entranceways which are embellished with reeded woodwork and one-pane transoms. 19. History		20. Significance Architecture: Although the house has suffered from neglect, it is an important cultural resource of the county. It exhibits qualities of five workmanship and design, and is an outstanding example of the Federal style in the county.

18. executed in common bond with a row of headers every five rows. All facade and rear bays have jack-arches, and all windows have wooden pegged framing. A corbelled cornice embellishes the facade and the rear of the house. Double stack interior gable-end chimneys with a gable window at each end set off the block. Rear windows are 9/6 pane and side windows are 6/6 pane with rounded supporting arches. The gable roof is covered with tin, and the house sits on a limestone foundation. The square-like structure measures 40 feet by 36 feet.

The interior is embellished with symmetrical woodwork, and the original wide plank ash and poplar flooring are intact. Each front room has floor to ceiling, six panel wallpresses. The two rear rooms each have an enclosed two-run stairway leading to the upper level.

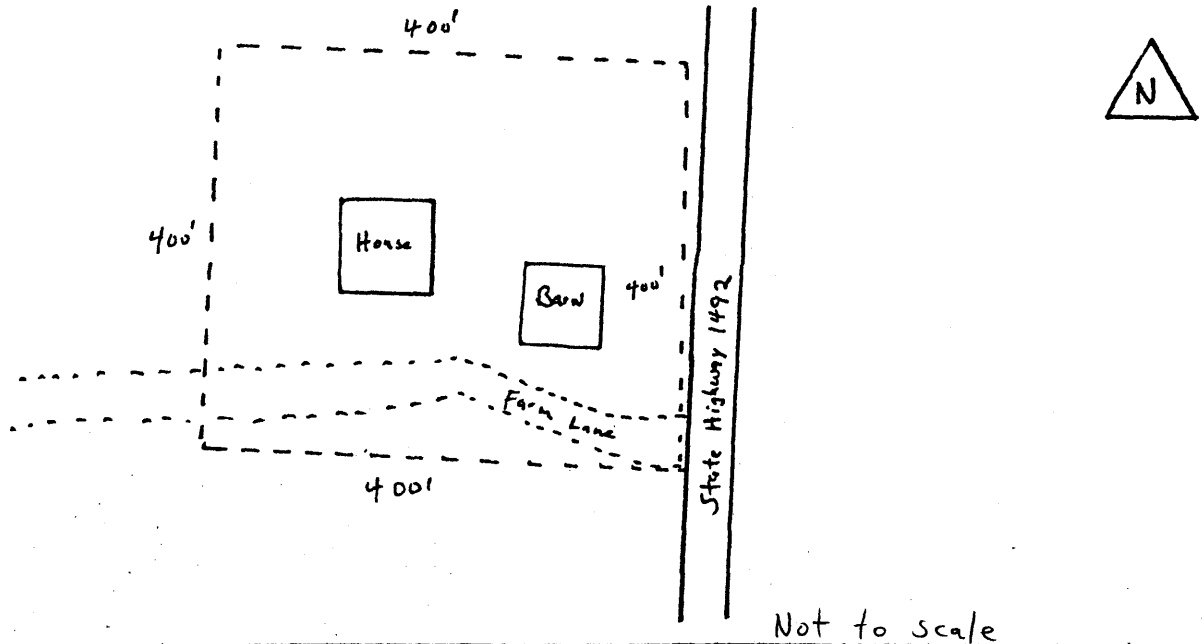
