44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

Beginning east 14° south of the stone house, at the road, thence west 2° south 1900 ft. to B, thence north 800 ft. to C at the branch, thence east 1600 ft. to D at the road, thence south with road 820 ft. to the beginning. Boundary drawn to include the uncommon site on top of the hill and dramatic approach to house.

45. Description and House Plan:

One-story, four-bay, hall-parlor, dry-stone house with one-story stone ell. Front doorway in second bay spanned by 1/2 round arch with voussoirs, fanlight above door, panelled reveals. Superior masonry; large, shaped stones laid in regular courses, suggestion of Flemish bonding (photo #1); no voussoirs above windows; solid stone door sills. Large windows have 12/12 sash, pegged frames, ovolo trim, square sills. Front door has six panels; rear door is batten. Upper Ordovician fossiliferous limestone; carefully repointed with steeple pointing. Square windows upstairs flanking chimneys. Square-hewn joists. Interior partition wall of hewn studs and split lathe; enclosed corner stair along partition wall, arises from rear of hall, space taken from parlor. Upstairs partition wall of beaded boards; stair rail has square banisters set on diagonal into beaded board on floor. Knee wall and collar ties upstairs. All three fireplaces have flattened segmental arches, none cooking size.


Ell was built at same time as house—there is no break in the masonry of north wall. Exterior door on north end of parlor. House size is 42 x 33, including ell. Exceptional woodwork: between rooms, fluted trim, reeded reveal. To ell room, double-faced trim, paneled reveal. Window frames double faced, reveals paneled. In hall, front door and window trim fluted, square corner blocks with modillions (photo #4).

A large contemporary addition is under construction to the west rear of the house, connected by an enclosed glass-walled hyphen. It is carefully located so it cannot be seen from the front of the house.

House is located on top of hill (uncommon for stone houses, as at GD-18, N.R.) between two branches of Bullskin Creek, has beautiful view of surrounding country side.
