

- 4. Owner: Bob Johnsen, 1607 8th, Las Vegas, N.M.
- 7. Description: Rectangular shape with asymmetrical bays and porch; rusticated light brown sandstone foundation; common bond brick walls (1st + 2nd), frame half-story; wood shingled roof, dormers and gables; small overhang, unornamented (3rd), with frieze board and scroll modillions (2nd), or frieze boards (1st rear); 1/1 double-hung, fixed, transom/fixed windows with board surrounds (3rd), rusticated sills and continuous wooden lintel/frieze board (2nd and 1st rear), sandstone sills and segmental arches (1st front); stick porch railing, paired lumber yard classic columns, frieze board and dentils; sandstone under porch columns, lattice skirt. Located in a residential area with meadows and the Gallinas River to the rear.
- 8. Significance: Built about 1910, this house is one of the best of the city's (and therefore the state's) Free Classic Style houses. The mixture of local sandstone, brick and wood shingles, the stained glass windows and asymmetry harken back to the Queen Anne Style. The other details—the columns, simple porch entablature, eave modillions and roof bellcast—are drawn from the more current classical/colonial revivalism. The dormer windows and flanking eaves cleverly mimic the profile of the Palladian window in the side gable. This is the second conspicuous mansion of the Eighth Street Extension, discussed with Building #1511.
