#### **SUMMARY OF PRESENT AND ORIGINAL PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

3335 Via De La Reina is a two-story rectangular Spanish styled building constructed of stucco over hollow tile. Two stucco chimnies with barrel tile caps are located on the north and east sides of the building. The low-pitched hip roof is clad in clay barrel tile. Windows are six over six double hung wood sash and eight over eight wood casement. All have stone sills. The casement windows are set in a blind-headed arch containing a single glazed tile inset. A one-story enclosed porch of seven arched bays is located on the west side of the building. The louvered entry door has a plain frontispiece surround with a shield flanked by a floral pattern in its lintel. A stone molding caps the lintel which supports a wrought iron balcony. ## SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

3335 Via De La Reina is significant as one of 25 remaining structures built as part of the San Jose Estates development, a planned, self-contained suburban community developed in 1925 by a group of Jacksonville businessmen at the height of the Florida Land Boom. As do the majority of the original San Jose structures, the building reflects the Spanish or Mediterranean style of architecture developed for the subdivision by the Jacksonville architects Marsh and Saxelbye. The building possesses sufficient architectural integrity and historic significance through association with the San Jose development to be individually eligible for nomination as part of the accompanying thematic nomination.

#### TEXT SUPPORTING SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

3335 Via De La Reina was mortgaged to Telfair Stockton Company, a local real estate mortgage company who sold it back to San Jose when they found a buyer in M. H. Elton. With the rapid decline of the fortunes of the San Jose Estates Corporation, the building became the object of numerous transactions involving the San Jose Estates Corporation, the Florida National Bank, Stockton's Mortgage Company, Better Homes Company (a Stockton Company), O. P. Woodcock Company, Reconstruction Finance Company and Elton, who apparently lived in the building from 1926 through 1933 when it was sold to Tobi Joseph. They, in turn, sold the house to H. B. Cowen in 1940. The Cowen's lived in the house until 1976 when it was sold to to present owner. It retains its original garage and servants' quarters and is in the process of restoration.
