E. This skyscraper was built for Citizens National Bank (established in 1873) in 1916 after the designs of William Lee Stoddart of New York as Evansville's first tall steel frame structure. The style should be compared to the Hulman Building of about ten years later in which the older building's architectural formula of "base+column+capital" was abandoned.
