DESCRIPTION

ARCHITECTURAL STYLE McClelland front gable DATE c.1885
FORM 2 stories, front gable, three-bay front w/off-center entrance;
2-story gabled wing west side, 1 story rear wing w/porch to east
MATERIALS brick on stone foundation; American bond
FENESTRATION 1/1 aluminum sash; segmental arched window openings; one large
plate-glass window first floor front
FEATURES starbolts all sides; polygonal window bay east side;
frieze formed with narrow molding strip
ALTERATIONS full-length front porch c. 1900, with turned posts and sunburst
in pediment over steps
SITE narrow raised lot in late 19th century residential area

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE This house illustrates the ubiquity of the "McClelland" house form, found in Davenport from one end of the 19th century city to the other, with most occurrences near the central area. In this house, the typical three-bay front-gable form is distinguished from other examples by the full-height side wing and the large parlor window at the front (in place of the more common sash windows).

HISTORICAL DATA

H. Henry Pohlmann moved to this address in 1898, though the house may have been at this location for several decades. Pohlmann was a brick manufacturer with the family firm H.B. Pohlmann Sons.


