House retains original exterior appearance, except for addition of frame kitchen at rear c.1895.

Its two-foot-thick exterior walls of tabby are covered with sand-

colored, scored stucco.

The south center front has a double tiered portico over a high arcaded basement. Basement, wider than two upper stories, supports an unroofed terrace to each side. First story holds four stuccoed Tuscan columns; behind these are four engaged wooden columns. At the second story are four Doric columns with pilasters at wall behind. Has simple wooden entablatures and railings. Hip roof has small front pediment.

Two large windows per story to each side of portico in front portion; one window per story in shallower, rectangular rear portion-

giving each room a southern exposure.

Interior has extensive woodwork, Adamesque mantels, graceful stairway. Panelling and wainscotting are of cypress and yellow heart pine. Each room has fireplace and dolset.

One of the earliest surviving houses in Beaufort, South Carolina. Considered important influence in establishment of distinctive architecture of the city.

Inhabited by its builder, Thomas Fuller, prominent Low-country planter and his son, Richard Fuller, mid-nineteenth century Baptist preacher.

Bought by the Rev. Mansfield French, an abolitionist Methodist minister, during Civil War.

For many years in 20th century known as a guest house for artists, writers and architects.

Used as a residence during its entire existence.
