Bonds in the amount of \$10,000 were authorized by the residents of Sac County at an election held on July 7, 1860, for the purpose of building the first county courthouse. The total number of votes cast was only 41. The contract for this courthouse was awarded to a Fort Dodge builder. The specifications for the building required that it be made of brick, be 34 by 46 feet at its base, with a six-foot-high foundation. The first story had a nine-foot ceiling and sixteen-inch-thick walls. The second story with its one-foot-thick walls and thirteen-foot-high ceiling was finished into a courtroom. All of the woodwork was painted with three coats of white lead, except for some varnished oak and pine.

On March 13, 1873, the bids for the erection of the second courthouse were let. Its cement foundation cost \$1,500. Its four vaults cost \$400. The 84 by 56 foot limestone foundation supported its brick walls. The total cost of construction was \$30,000. This building burned on October 3, 1888. A \$200 reward prompted a constable of Lake City to arrest the arsonist who was convicted and sentenced to 12 years in the penitentiary.

The citizens of Sac County formed a company and pledged themselves to duplicate the new courthouse which had just been finished at Storm Lake. The county had received \$15,000 in insurance money after the burning of the previous courthouse, and the company of citizens raised an additional \$15,000 to complete their desired reproduction in 1889. Although the tower was removed in 1900 and a new slate roof was put on in 1911, the building appears relatively the same today as when it was first erected.
