Name: Beatty-Newell House (PU-90)

Description: Constructed in 1796, the Beatty-Newell House is a two-story rectangular single pen log house. The log has been covered with weatherboard and has three exterior chimneys. The main section of the building has a massive stone chimney and a smaller brick chimney while the added shed addition has a brick chimney. The interior of the building has been altered somewhat with the addition of new frame partition walls. The house rests on a stone foundation with the original cellar and kitchen area remaining. A two-story frame porch with rectangular posts is present on the main facade. Windows are two-over-two sash.

Significance: The Beatty-Newell House is one the earliest homes built south of the Cumberland River in Pulaski County. It was constructed in 1796 by early settler John Beatty and his wife who were some of the first settlers in the area. The house is of single pen log construction and it is one of the few log structures of this type in the county which has been continually occupied since its erection. The Beattys intermarried with the Newell family and the house has remained in the possession of the Newell family until the present. The Newell family members who have occupied the house have been prominent in local politics and business for over one hundred years. The log house has not been significantly altered since its sheathing with weatherboard in the late 19th century. The raised cellar and massive chimney are notable architectural features of the house.

Acreage: Approximately one acre.

<u>Verbal Boundary Description:</u> This house is sited on a rise above the road which runs immediately in front of the house. The house and lawn comprise approximately .8 acre. The house is bounded by the Bronston - Burnside Road on the east, a driveway on the north and hedge lines on the west and south.


