Dear Sir

We have your favour of the 11th & 16th - The small articles will be sent as soon as they can be obtained which will be in a day or two - The Oil will go forward today - We trust it is the very best and we paid \$1.30 per gal - Will send bill as soon as recd - We bought today 20 bales Cotton at 9 1/2¢ which has been sent - This with the 16 bales will carry you till Christmas, and in the mean time we hope to purchase a quantity at 9¢ - If we find that the money market would remain as it presents we should prefer buying the Cotton with your drafts as we should gain in interest - If however we should make large purchases it may be that we might prefer you to draw upon us, but would like it remain for the present -

As we wrote you we have changed the first 20 bales to you and shall credit you with the 12 bales goods - On reflection we will open an account with you as Agent, and charge all your drafts and all our purchases accordingly - We will credit the sales &c to same - This will be simple - When you make drafts

(Should you do so) you can make them in
that way as in your own name as you prefer.
Money is worth a little more than it was
last week and 6% is the lowest quotation
generally - There is now a little quiet

in the market but we are confident that
sales will commence early - Your goods
cannot weigh heavier than 3 yards to the
pound - We are inclined to think if
they were a little slacker twisted they
would look well - We want the weight
of each bale on the Invoice - List the
number of each and yards placed against
it - Yours truly
