

McIntosh County Courthouse

Location: 110 North First, Eufaula, Oklahoma 40, McIntosh County 091

Description: Condition: good, unaltered, original site

The McIntosh County Courthouse is a three-sotry, red brick building with a raised main entranceway on the second floor. A concrete staircase with brick banisters leads to the front door. A stone cornice and frieze encircles the top of the building and is surmounted by a low brick parapet. The wood frames of the windows are painted white. The building has small square and diamond-shaped stone decorations above the second floor windows. Plain brick pilasters with stone capitals and bases separate the window bays of the second and third stories. A small stone pediment and stone facing ornament the doorways. The central portion of each of the four sides of the courthouse projects slightly from the corner wall lines. The building has a flat roof and a single brick chimney located at the southwest corner.

Significance:

The McIntosh County Courthouse is significant because it is a good example of the functional architectural design used for numerous public buildings in the state. A square, sturdy building, it also incorporates some simplified elements of classical architecture, for example, pilasters used to space the windows. The courthouse is a landmark for the small county seat of Eufaula and it admirably serves the needs of the surrounding area as the center of county government. The building is in good condition and is typical of several Oklahoma county courthouses in its architectural style.

The building has small square and diamond-shaped stone decorations above the second floor windows. The central portion of each of the four sides of the courthouse projects slightly from the corner wall lines. The building has a flat roof and single brick chimney located at the southwest corner.

Significance: 1926; Builder/architect: Tankersley Construction Co./Layton, Hicks, and Forsyth

The McIntosh County Courthouse is significant because it is a local landmark for the small county seat of Eufaula and because it serves the needs of the surrounding area as the center of county government. It is a good example of a simple and functional public building designed by one of the architectural partnerships headed by Solomon Andrew Layton. The courthouse incorporates a number of the simplified elements of neo-classical architectural details typical of Layton's designs. Political events of McIntosh County have been focused on the courthouse in Eufaula since the building was completed in 1926. The building is in good condition and is typical of several Oklahoma county courthouses in its architectural style.
