ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION AND PRESENT CONDITION: Neo-Classical-Commercial. 2 story brick building, the brick is beige with a pink cast; mortar joints are dusty rose in color. It is laid in common bond. The building has I-beam framing system, with beams encased in wood. 1st floor has 2 entrances, glass showcases run length of front facade. 2nd floor is four bays wide, each bay divided by a pilaster which has a sandstone base and capital. All of the pilasters support a complete entablature, the architrave being sandstone, the frieze being brick laid vertically, and the cornice with modillions being pressed metal.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE (FROM ORIGINS TO PRESENT): In Columbus' 1918 city directory, "Kress" is listed for the first time at "1117-1119." Since "Kress" had been listed in earlier directories at only "1117," this 1918 listing indicates that the present building was constructed to enlarge previous facilities. This store has served the Columbus community for 61 years in the capacity of a dimestore. It was closed in 1979.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): Architecture: This building is a fine example of commercial neoclassicism, with its pilasters and complete entablature. along with the general window treatment. It is the largest, most complete example of this Local History: This Kress Store has served the Columbus community for 61 years. Designed as a Kress Store in 1918, it remained one of the leading dime stores in the downtown area for 61 years. It is typical of Kress stores being built in downtown areas during the early 1900's.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: The window surrounds are sandstone, with a keystone of the same. The sash windows are 2/2 in configuration with a metal transom above each window. These transoms which serve as air vents, have a decorative geometric design.

The parapet has a central section which rises above the rest and has the letters K-R-E-S-S in metal on it. The remainder of the parapet has recessed panels and dividing posts with decoratively laid brickwork in the center. The whole of the parapet is capped with sandstone.
