DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

These are roughly pyramidal-shaped rock mounds, hollow in the center, with chimney-like openings in the top. On one side at the base is an opening approximately 10 inches wide and 6 inches high allowing access to the hollow center portion of the rock ovens. The ovens are made of flat to rounded basalt, and are approximately 5 feet wide at the base. They vary from about 3 to 5 feet in height.

Two such ovens are found in the Turnbull National Wildlife Refuge approximately two miles apart, and near the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railroad tracks which pass through the northwest portion of this refuge. Both are built on the edge of natural soil mounds which are typical in the mounded soil type of the channeled scablands of Eastern Washington.

These rock ovens were built by Italian laborers who worked on construction of the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railroad in 1.906 . There were several contractors and subcontractors crews building the railrad in this vicinity.

The nearest labor camp to these ovens was at Mock, about 1-2 miles to the southeast. About 50 to 75 men worked out of this camp, which was run by an Italian subcontractor named Gabriel Ballante. Construction through the basalt rock outcrops was very difficult, and required extensive blasting. Holes for the charges were hand drilled with drills up to 16 feet long.

Fires were built in these ovens to heat the rocks. Coals were removed and the bread loaves were inserted through the side openings with long wooden paddles. The Italians subsisted almost entirely on bread and macaroni during the construction period. Only occasionally did they purchase meat from local farmers.
