This solidly constructed cross planned courthouse is two stories high and features a tall pyramidally capped clock tower with open belfry that rises over the entrance. Hooded clocks on the cap face in four directions. Pavilions project from the four corners, the roof is in hipped sections with intersecting gables. The main entrance is a stoop with a recessed round arch doorway. Segmentally arched windows are on the first floor, round arched ones with decorative stone keystones on the second. There is a stone water table and a metal cornice.

The interior has been renovated, paneling has been added in offices as has carpet, asbestos tiled ceilings, metal and glass doors.



As the center of local government, the courthouse is a focal point in the of every citizen in the community.

It is an excellent example of the interest in Romanesque design that continued into the 20th century in Georgia.
