DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Watson Cabin is the oldest house in Tahoe City that has retained the original architecture and is well preserved as it was built in 1908. It is the only log structure in the North Lake Tahoe area.

The house is built on a cliff above the shoreline of Lake Tahoe. The back of the house faces the water and the entrance faces on the main street of Tahoe City. The garage and tool house (not attached to the house) was built in 1916.

The log cabin is built from a local product, hand hewn logs, and is unique in the area. It's overall dimension is:  $17' \times 26' = 442$  sq. ft. and the front entry is  $6' \times 12' = 72$  sq. ft. and the addition is  $12' \times 12' = 144$  sq. ft. The foundation is of native stone and cement and the wall construction is of logs well preserved and put together with cement. It has wooden window and door frames.

It has a covered entryway over the front door and the gable ends under eaves are designed with small polished logs and formerly had deer horns. The fireplace is of native stone and cement. The roof is shingled with steep gables to shed the snow. The living room and kitchen are the two main rooms downstairs. There are three rooms and a bathroom upstairs. The enclosed sun porch located at the rear of the structure was added in 1914. A wood storage area was added off the kitchen area in 1920 and was enclosed by a commercial tenant in 1940. One stairway with trap door leads to the upstairs.

Two pine trees and three North American Poplars and three Lilac bushes were planted in 1908. All are still growing. The bird bath and fountain of natural colored rock are from the Truckee River area and was added later. Ground cover of clover and native wild flowers grow in the yard.

The cement and stone foundation was installed about 1914. The front porch was replaced with native slate about 1918 and the bathroom was installed in 1914.

8 SIGNIFICANCE

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Watson Log Cabin was built with logs which were cut and trimmed by hand in the wooded area northeast of Tahoe City where the cabin is located. The logs were secured and made weatherproof with the cement chinking placed between the log sections. Robert Montgomery Watson, noted trailblazer of the surrounding Sierras and prominent lumberman, built this home for his son, Robert, and daughter-in-law, Stella.

Robert Montgomery Watson was the only log cabin builder in the North Lake Tahoe area. He built only one other log structure during that time period (1908 - 1910), the Gatekeeper's Cabin. This cabin was destroyed by fire in 1978.

Robert and Stella were very involved in community growth. Robert became an important lumberman like his father, Robert Montgomery, and assisted the new population coming to Lake Tahoe by supplying lumber to build homes and public buildings being constructed. Stella Watson drove the school bus for 14 years. Robert Montgomery Watson, his son Robert, and Stella Watson are buried in the family plot in the Tahoe City Cemetary.

The Watson Log Cabin is the only log structure which still remains in the North Lake Tahoe area. Several older members of the community would like to see the Watson Log Cabin restored and allowed to remain a monument to "Old Tahoe".

The Watson Log Cabin is an excellent example of the nostalgic "rustic" architectural trend which prevailed in the early 1900's. The cabin's architect/builder, Robert M. Watson, was a noted trailblazer of the Tahoe area and was considered a "pioneer" by the local citizens. His appreciation of the natural beauty of Lake Tahoe influenced the design of the Watson cabin which looks out onto the lake's shoreline.

The Watson Log Cabin, with hand-hewn logs and deer horn embellishment, stands as a monument to the "old days" when nature and man co-existed harmoniously. Native stone and cement were used for the foundation, logs from trees of the area make up the walls, even the ornamental bird bath was made from local, natural materials.

The Watson Lôg Cabin is a well-preserved structure that depicts the romantic feeling of wilderness appreciated. Throughout the years Tahoe City has grown and, one by one, modern-shaped buildings replaced small cabin structures. This development has depleted Tahoe City of all but one example of the old days. The Watson Log Cabin must be preserved to remind all of us of Tahoe's romantic past.


