The Peery Mill site is composed of a c. 1910 concrete dam across the Little River and foundations of mills built between 1842 and c. 1890. These foundations are rectangular in plan and consist of limestone blocks from 1842, poured concrete foundations added c. 1910, and concrete block additions from c. 1960. Adjacent to the mill dam is a large rectangular spillway for the turbines. Within the foundation walls are footings for machinery, intact turbine wheels, and remains of milling machinery. The site is located along the Little River in a rural area north of Walland.

This mill site was inventoried in 1982 and consisted of a two-story frame mill building constructed ca. 1890. This building burned in 1987 leaving only the present foundation ruins.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Peery Mill Site is significant under criterion A for its importance as an early grist mill in the county. The site features some of the most intact grist mill ruins in the county and the dam continues to be a major feature on this stretch of the Little River. This site was regarded as one of the most favorable mill seats in the county and a milling operation was located here from 1842 to 1987. This mill was the center of a small community known as Melrose consisted of several residences and commercial buildings. The mill site is the most notable historic property in Melrose.

In 1842, Samuel Henry was allowed by the legislature to build a dam across the Little River at a site just north of present day Walland. Samuel Henry (not to be confused with miller Samuel Henry of Baker's Creek) constructed a frame turbine powered mill at this site and operated it for a number of years. Later operators of the mill included Scales Amerine who sold the mill in 1906 to Bud Hitch. Around the turn of the century the original building was replaced by a two-story frame structure. During most of the 20th century the mill was operated by the Peery Brothers and it was also known as the Little River Mills. The mill remained in operation until the early 1980s and was later burned.


