DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ralston Industrial Complex is located one mile west of Mendham at Roxiticus Road and Route 24. Route 24, which was just recently improved and widened, is terribly close to the Mill, Post Office, and, on the other side of the road, the Cotton and Woolen Mill. The Manor House, however, is not endangered by the highway at present, although the owner of the house has voiced a feeling for demolishing the building.

General Store,

The General Store, built around 1786, is a 1 1/2 story clapboard building with gable roof and front overhang. There is a small gable end brick chimney in the east end. The store has three bays, one an offset center door. The two front windows are 20/15 sash with batten board shutters. The frame of the store is hand hewn oak. The clapboard on the rear and sides is oak, while the front is covered with wide tongued and grooved pine boards.

The building served as a general store for the Mill and community until 1892. At that time it was converted into the Ralston Post Office.

Most likely the store was a one room (31' by 25') building with storage space in the attic and the basement. When it became a Post Office the store was made into three small rooms.

Mill.

The Mill was built just prior to the American Revolution. It is a 2 1/2 story stone structure. The stone is uncoursed rubble with corner quoins. The west elevation has a clapboard gable end. The Mill was converted into a residence in 1940. The conversion changed the windows, added dormers, and installed a center chimney. Although the exterior is basically intact and most of the original frame still remains, the entire interior of the mill was converted into a home in 1940 using many of the old mill pieces. Just above the Mill is the remains of the dam, pond, and raceway which supplied water power to the mill.

Manor House.

The Manor House was built in 1781 and is a 2 1/2 story clapboard building with a gambrel roof and paired gable end brick chimneys. The house has five bays and a center hall. There is a small porch over the center door. The windows are now Victorian, being changed in the 1880's from the original 12/12 sash. Inside, there are two rooms to each side of the hall, each having fireplaces with Federal mantels.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
COMMERCE.

John Logan, builder of the mill, claimed he supplied the Continental Army with supplies while they were encamped at Morristown. He later presented the government with a thirty thousand dollar claim for payment, but it was never paid.

Industry.

Logan eventually lost his mill, and in 1786 John Ralston purchased it at a sheriff's sale. During Ralston's ownership (1786-1819) a thriving early American industrial community developed. The grist mill, store, cotton and woolen mill, lumber and saw mill, and several other small enterprises comprised of Ralston's businesses, of which the mill, the general store, and the cotton and woolen mill are still extant.

Other. (First Post Office of Ralston)

The general store became Ralston's first Post Office in 1892, and functioned as such until 1941.

Architecture.

The Manor House is a fine example of Federal style architecture and has a good deal of original hardware such as strap hinges, wrought iron latches and handles and door locks intact as well as eight Federal style fireplace mantels.

Commerce/Industry.

In the late 18th century the business center of Mendham Township was at the crossroads of Roxiticus Road and the William Penn Highway which was locally called Ralston. It was so named because the mill, manor house, general store, and, later, the cotton and woolen factory at the intersection were all owned, along with several thousand acres of area farmland, by John Ralston from 1786-1819. Although the business center of the township shifted to the center of the town of Mendham in the mid-19th century leaving Ralston

7. Description (cont.)

The kitchen fireplace had, at one time, a Dutch bake oven, now bricked up. To the rear of the hallway is the stairway to the upstairs. The second floor is identical to the first.

Cotton and Woolen Factory.

Orginally built in the early 19th century this building is a 2 1/2 story frame and shingle structure with a stone foundation built along the bank of India Brook. The roof is gable. The building has been extensively altered to accommodate a family residence.

The entire district has only four buildings, all of them described above.

8. Significance

isolated, the mill continued to operate and the name continued to be Ralston. Even when the owners were no longer Ralstons' the name stuck.

This complex exemplifies the fast disappearing early American industrial concept -- a small active business or two, a manor house up on the hill nearby, and a general store alongside the mill in order to supply customers (mostly farmers) with their most every need. Few of these 18th century complexes exists in New Jersey today.
