Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Hensley Historic District is comprised of 279 properties, of which 207 are contributing, configured on a street grid surveyed in 1848 by C. S. Laymen, continued by the City Surveyor Thomas White in 1850. It is the residential neighborhood immediately to the north of downtown San Jose. The structures constructed between 1865 and 1930 were predominantly single family residences; the majority remain so today. They represent various architectural styles, including classic revival, Italianate, Queen Anne, San Francisco Stick and mixed revivals, composing a largely "Victorian" townscape. This variety includes the early 20th century bungalows which are similar in scale and mass to the earlier workingmen's cottages. Intrusions are few and of minor impact to the overall nature and quality of the district. The district is bounded roughly by N. Second Street, N. Sixth Street, E. Empire Street and E. Julian Street.

The 1848 properties were originally eight to a square block with subsequent division maintaining a regular north-south block division though the widths have been reduced at each subdivision. The streets were surveyed at 80', with N. Fifth Street (Main Street) 100' in width, and so they remain.

North Fifth Street - originally Main Street was intended to be a major north-south artery, however, it was prohibited from fulfilling that function by Washington Square (not in the District, now San Jose State University). The additional width accommodated the North-South Horse Railroad which served the area from 1875 to 1901. A raised median, once used for streetcars now has turf and young trees fulfilling the original proposal of Charles Mulford Robinson in 1909 to identify San Jose as the "Garden City" with public as well as private gardens.

The Southern Pacific Railroad occupies a right-of-way established in 1864, bisecting the district on a line from N. Second and Bassett Streets to N. Sixth and E. Empire Streets.

During the past 100 years many of the structures have sustained varying degrees of modification, however, the visual integrity of the District is retained. Currently, there is a movement to rehabilitate the structures observing the original architectural designs. The definition of the styles and detailing through renovation or appropriate painting has brought an increased awareness of the rich architectural diversity appearing within the Hensley Historic District.

The historic archeology within the District is known to be extensive. Sites of prehistoric habitation have been found in close proximity to the District. Very little excavation has occurred within the area and no prehistoric sites have been recorded to date.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The significance of the Hensley Historic district is derived from the architecture of the 207 contributing structures, the contributions to the development of San Jose made by the original and subsequent residents and from the transportation systems which contributed to the development of California's first City, San Jose. The area contains the largest remaining concentration of intact residences, developed between 1870 and 1918, the preponderance between 1880 and 1900, of the victorian styles in San Jose. The residents of this district included the founders of local industry, financial institutions and civic leaders, as well as merchants, small services entrepreneurs, and the general labor force. The area represents a spectrum of Victorian residential styles in varying sizes and ornamentation. This concentration of Victorian residential architecture is the area in San Jose that conveys history and architectural achievement from the late 1880's through the turn of the century.

In the period 1865 to 1900 induced by the services of the developing transportation systems, the railroads and shipping ports, San Jose emerged as a major commercial city. The residential area nominated as Hensley Historic District grew in response to that development. Third Street evolved as one of the affluent residential neighborhoods, its architectural style climaxing in the grand and ornate Queen Anne mansions of the 1880's and 1890's. The scale of residences decreases to the east with N. Fifth and Sixth Streets developed for the small business owner or working man's residential needs. The proposed district encompasses a variety of Victorian, transitional and bungalow architecture in scales representative of the socio-economic population of San Jose during the years just prior to and subsequent to 1900.

The land was surveyed and the grid of streets established by C. S. Lyman in 1848, with City surveyor Thomas White finalizing the survey in 1850. Prior to this the northern boundary of San Jose was Julian St. which is the approximate southern boundary of this district. The area had experienced flooding and was therefore not developed until this problem was resolved, to some extent, by levies and dikes. The survey plotted Fifth Street as Main Street and designated the 100 foot wide boulevard to become the north entrance to the downtown. Transportation through the district was by means of horse-drawn railroads (1870 - 1901) on Fifth Street, Southern Pacific Railroad on Fourth Street and electric streetcars on First and Sixth Street. The location of transit systems appears to have influenced the value and stature of the residences. Third Street became the prestige address and the location of grand Queen Anne villas. Fifth Street, the streetcar tracks removed, now has a raised landscaped median and retains the various styles of architecture of the smaller house and cottage Fourth Street contains a mixture of small to medium size residences reflecting the in-fill pattern of this district that continued in the early years of the 20th Century.

North Second Street and First Street were both built with elaborate and large residences, many of which have been removed. Second street retains the character of the

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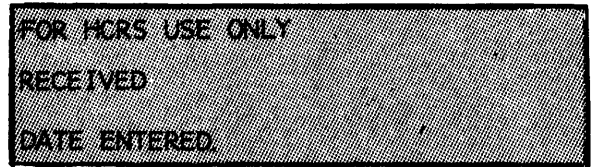

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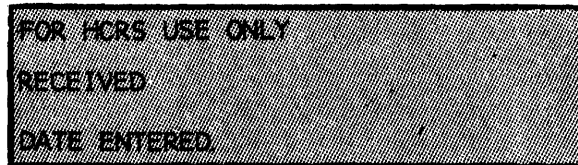

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1880's and is the eastern boundary of the Historic District.

Trees of magnificent stature are found throughout the district though few of the elegant gardens for which San Jose was given the title "The Garden City" remain. The miniature Queen Anne Villa at 284 Washington Street retains some of the specimen plants from the original formal garden.

The commercial structures within the district were limited to in-town convenience markets such as those on Empire and Fourth. Dairies were located on Second at Hensley and adjoining the residence at the S. E. corner of Fifth and Empire, a popular stop on the way to and from town. The proposed Historic District derives its name from the family that owned the larger of the dairies, the Hensley. The name is perpetuated on the street that ran in front of the dairy, east to Fourth Street, and is located within the proposed historic district.

The architecture of the Hensley Historic District is the visible statement of its significance. Within the six square blocks are found examples of the architect and builders' talents unparalleled in San Jose. Their expressions of Victorian, revival eclectic, and Bungalow styles developed in a harmonious relationship to each other that displays the concern of the craftsman for an aesthetically pleasing residential environment. Not until the late 1940's does this concern diminish and obtrusive structures are constructed indicating a change in values, needs and ownership within the district.

The houses reflect the economic prosperity of San Jose present during the 60 years of the development within the district. The district communicates a sense of stability and permanence indicative of the attitudes of its original residents to make San Jose their permanent home. This sense of permanence is returning to the district, as is shown by the rehabilitation currently underway. The proposed district contains many variations of the popular architectural styles of the time. Located in the southern blocks of the district are the classic two-story Italianate residences and apartment buildings. Perhaps the oldest structure in the district is the Italianate residence at 361 N. Fifth Street which dates from 1864.

The 400 block of N. Third Street became the home of several of San Jose's leading citizens. This block exhibits the opulence of the high fashion extremely decorative Queen Anne architecture popular in the 1880 & 1890's.

The contributions of the civic and industrial leaders who built homes and lived in this area further enhances the historical significance and intrinsic value of the individual residences and the proposed district. Representative of the original residents are the following:

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411 N. 3rd Street.

(1892) William Knox Beans; President of the bank of San Jose, oldest bank in San Jose currently Bank of the West. Mr. and Mrs. Beans were founders and supporters of many cultural organizations.

(1918) Arthur M. Free, District Attorney and U. S Congressman lived at this address.

424 N. 3rd Street.

William Nathaniel Noble; Businessman, entrepreneur and rancher with substantial holdings in Wyoming. Jennie Sheppard Noble, designer of the house, was a sponsor of many cultural activities including the San Jose Symphony Orchestra. Each of their 6 children became millionaires in their own right. The home is still owned by the Noble family - Mrs. Mildred Noble.

(1903) Marshall Pomeroy orchardists for whom streets and a school have been named. Warren H. Pomeroy, Cloris C. Pomeroy owners of Pomeroy Bros. Clothing and Furnishing Store for Men and Boys are also shown at this address.

(1901) Judge Perley and Mrs. Gosbey, Superior Court Judge and President of the School Board. Mrs. Gosbey was active in social programs including the Ladies Benevolent Society and Red Cross.

San Jose, not unlike most cities, has developed neighborhood boundaries determined by transit corridors and zoning ordinances. This is the basis for the Hensley areas compact relatively undisturbed existence and hence the location of the historic district boundaries.

Julian Street is the approximate northern boundary of the commercial downtown. There are several structures of similar age, design, and scale south of Julian; these are included within the district.

To the north of E. Empire a few structures remain from the turn of the century along N. Fourth and the north side of E. Empire near N. Fourth. The areas east of Sixth Street

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and west of Second Street have developed or redeveloped outside the historical and architectural frame of the district. The boundaries enclose an area of cohesive structures visually identifying the time of their construction.

Residences with a predominance of Eastlake details are found throughout the District. These are often mixed with the design elements of the Queen Anne and Italianate styles. Contributing to the visual interest and historical intrigue of the area are several structures which stand as sole expressions of their defined or eclectic style. The Dutch Colonial Revival with its interesting gambrel at 472 North 4th is such a structure. 129 E. Julian, an ornate Victorian Gothic with steamboat details, and 272 E. Washington a Classical Revival of absolute symmetry are unique to the area.

The eclectic composition of architectural elements occurring throughout the district contribute to the sense of the city's growth, as development spread to the north and then inward to fill vacant parcels. The district displays the craftsman's dedication to quality in the use of wood, brick and stone. This is particularly true in the decorative wooden details present in all the architectural styles.

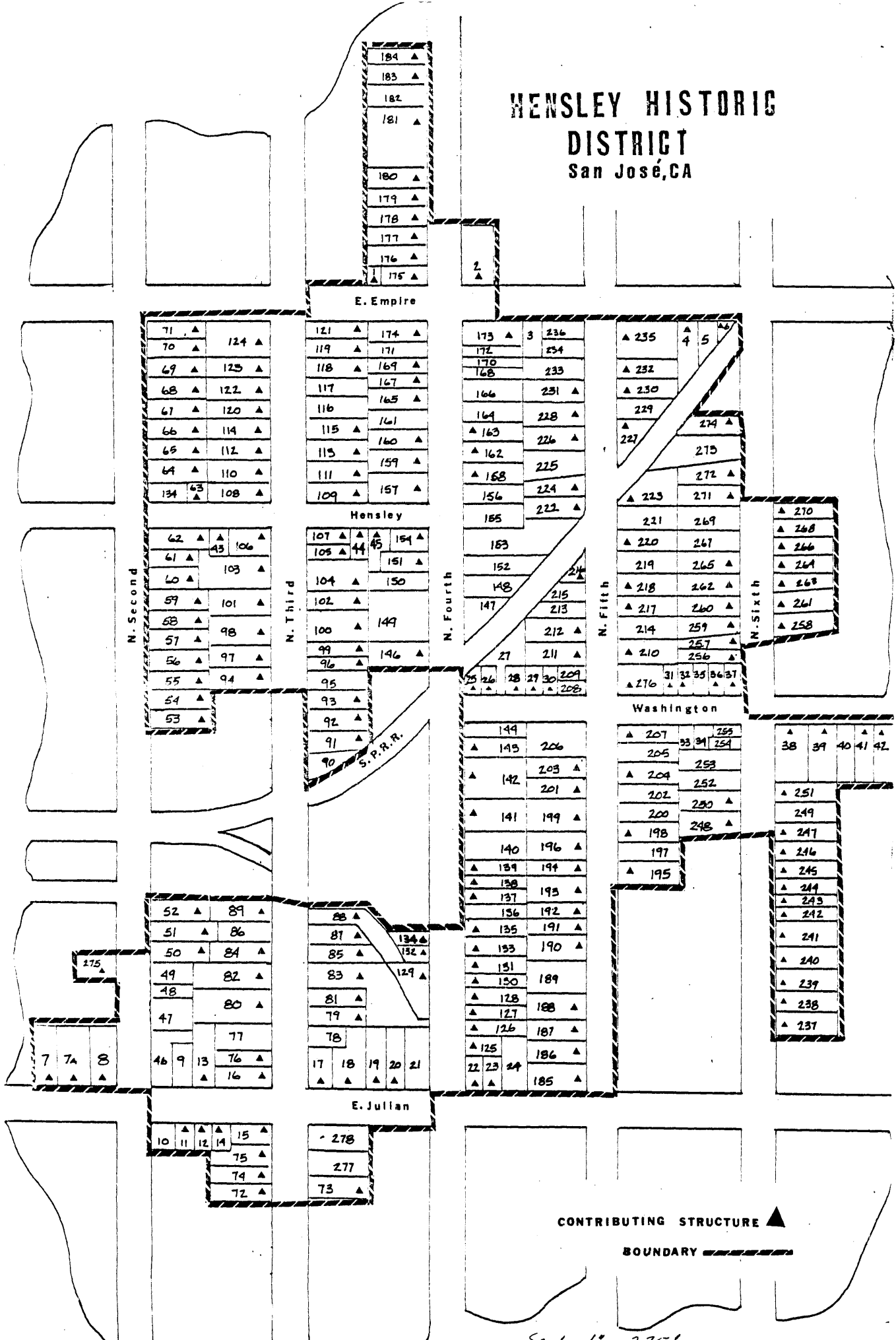
The Hensley Historic Area is undergoing changes brought about by the renewed interest in architecturally significant older homes and an interest in living close to an urban center. Recent changes in ownership have shown that both prime users and investors are interested in rehabilitating the structures and re-establishing a viable residential neighborhood.

At the request of residents the city administration is studying a lower density, currently R-3, for the area. The decision will have a major impact, positive or negative upon the future of this resource.

The Hensley Historic District represents the most complete concentration of architectural styles popular during the years from 1865 to 1918 in San Jose. This area exhibits the tangible remains of residential growth which responded to San Jose's transformation from an agricultural hub into a city of financial, commercial, industrial and cultural vitality. The neighborhood retains the strong sense of time and place associated with this period of San Jose's history.
