



#### SUMMARY

The Lloyd Woman's Club building is located on Bond Street (no number), in the un-incorporated community of Lloyd, Jefferson County, Florida. The main, north facade fronts onto Bond Street. The 1939, one-story frame vernacular building has an irregular footprint, rests on a brick pier foundation, and has a cross gable roof, surfaced with metal. A brick chimney pierces the roof peak of a southern extension. The exterior is horizontal drop siding, and windows are 2/2, double-hung wooden sash.

#### SETTING

When constructed in 1939, the building was in an open field, and located on the south side of Bond Street, the community's main east/west thoroughfare, and directly across from the newly constructed WPA Lloyd School. Trees and shrubs surround the property and building, and a circular drive and club sign are adjacent to Bond Street (Photo #1). The crossroads of Bond and the north/south Main Street is less than one-half mile to the east. The 1939 building lies just west of the Lloyd Historic District (NR 1991), which has a period of significance from 1840 - 1920.

#### DESCRIPTION

#### Exterior

The building was constructed with a "T" footprint with the main block having side gables, and a central, cross gable southerly extension to accommodate a kitchen. A small addition onto the west gable end was made in 1963. Built on brick piers, the building has drop siding exterior and metal roof.

The main, north facade contains central double doors with four lights in the upper half. The entry is reached from a wooden porch with three steps and a concrete ramp. The porch is sheltered by a gable portico supported by two square corner posts (Photo #2). Molding around the tops of the posts gives the appearance of capitals. The entry is flanked by pairs of windows with narrow shutters. One window is in the western extension whose roof line is below the main block roof line.

The west elevation has a gable extension with a louvered vent in the gable and two small windows on the south side (Photo #3). A louvered vent is visible in the gable of the main block. The south extension is visible

with one window in its wall, and a the profile of the rear portico is visible as well.

The <u>south elevation</u> has a gable extension with a gable portico at the west corner, and a pair of windows to the east (Photo #4). A window is visible to the west and east within the main block.

The <u>east elevation</u> has the gable end of the main block with a louvered vent within the gable, and two windows (Photo #5). One window within the side wall of the south extension is visible.

#### Interior

Within the main entrance is one main room with a brick fireplace centered on the southern wall (Photos #6&7). The floors are wooden, and the walls and ceiling are finished with tongue and groove pine wood paneling. Two doors in the western wall of the main room access men's and women's toilets, and a storage area. Two doors flanking the fireplace access the kitchen which has a door in the southwest corner. A sink and counter, with under-counter cabinets, and simple wood shelving, are present (Photos #8&9).

#### ALTERATIONS

In 1954, running water was installed. In 1963 the west extension to accommodate restrooms was added.

#### SUMMARY

The Lloyd Woman's Club is nominated to the National Register under Criterion A on the local level in the area of Social History. Prior to the building's construction, and ever since, the club has been involved with community betterment programs. The club house is the only community facility Lloyd has had, past or present. The building is a good example of vernacular construction, and maintains its architectural integrity. The property is nominated under the Multiple Property cover "Clubhouses of Florida's Woman's Clubs," under the historic context of Great Depression, World War II and Aftermath, 1929-1948, and under the Property Type F.1, Clubhouses: Frame Vernacular.

#### HISITORIC CONTEXT

Florida became a United States territory in 1821, and Tallahassee was made the territorial capital in 1824. One of the first settlers in the Lloyd area was William Bailey who established a grist mill to serve the surrounding plantations. Bailey's Mill was the first name for the late 1820s settlement. Jefferson County was established in 1827. In 1831 a post office was established at the mill. Cotton was the primary crop in the antibellum period in north Florida, and Jefferson County was a part of that plantation economy. The cotton crop had to be shipped out of the port at St. Mark's on the Gulf Coast, but transportation became easier when a railroad connecting the region to Lake City to the east, and Georgia, was built in 1858. When a railroad depot was built at Lloyd, it dominated the economic activity of the settlement, which then was called Station #2, number one being Tallahassee. Following the Civil War, the region became more diversified agriculturally, and by the 1870s, the community, now called Lloyd, prospered and grew slowly until the 1920s. Boll weevils devastated cotton production in 1916 and 1917, and with the growing use of automobiles, Tallahassee and Monticello became the preferred places to buy supplies. Lloyd remained a quiet community of about 300 people. In the late 1930s, a modest amount of construction occurred at the western boundary to the community, which included the WPA assisted school across the street from the club house.

In 1917, the Women's and Girl's Club was organized as a part of the Home Demonstration work begun in 1911. It was the second Home Demonstration group to form in Jefferson County, the first being in Aucilla, and the third in Lamont. Six members formed the group and three

were elected officers. At their first meeting their numbers tripled. Reflecting wartime concerns, the club promoted sugarless recipes, clothing makeovers, "Victory" gardening, and assisting the Red Cross. Conforming to the format of Home Demonstration Extension offices, the club changed their name to The Lloyd Home Demonstration Club. The club, however, always kept a bank account in the name of the "Women's Club." They met in a local school room and private homes. Home demonstration work was discontinued from 1921-1929. T.H. Lloyd, the town's founder and prominent businessman offered the women two rooms within the Lloyd-Bond House (NR 1984). The club by this time desired a permanent community center, and every year a finance committee raised money with many activities including cake sales, suppers, and most popular, political rally suppers. During the Great Depression the Works Progress Administration furnished labor for community buildings, the women applied for the support. Being \$100 short of the cash needed, they successfully appealed to the community to raise the lump sum.

#### HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE

The frame community building was formally opened on April 11, 1939 with a luncheon for 65 members of the Jefferson County Home Demonstration Council. A formal dedication was held May 25<sup>th</sup>. The club continued their earlier activities of a village clean-up day, shrubbery purchases, and food demonstrations. When active, the Girl Scouts, and the 4-H Club met in the building. The club continued their tradition of hosting dinners where political candidates would speak, as well as hosting annual community suppers, and the building has always been used as a polling place.

The name of the club underwent several changes during the 1960s, adopting the name of "The Lloyd Homemakers Club" in 1973, and most recently the "Lloyd Women's Club" in 1975. Despite these changes, the name "Woman's Club" has always been painted on a sign since its construction, and has been referred to as such within the community. The club has worked to beautify the town, build a playground, install street lights, and has confronted community issues of the water supply, impact of the interstate highway, and a proposed gas pipeline. The club contributed to the well being of Lloyd until being officially disbanded in May of 1991.


