Architectural Description and Significance: <b>This 1 1/2 story Flagg System house is 25 x 50 feet. It has limestone exterior walls and faces south. There are four pairs of ridge dormers and five gable dormers. The gable roof has composition shingles and there are two square-topped chimneys. The plan of the house was originally L-shaped, but a two story addition containing family room and two bedrooms has made the house T-shaped. The original garage is attached. The beam and girder ceiling throughout the first floor was extended to the first floor addition. inward over tile sills. There is no basement and the laundry room is on the first floor. There is a small attic and built-in storage space. The upstairs bathroom is one step up from the level of the hall. The partitions are 1 3/4" thick. The house is not out of place in this neighborhood of somewhat larger homes.
