in Floyd County. Their first child was born September 16, 1864 and named John C. Calhoun Mayo.

In 1869, Thomas moved his family from Pike County back to Johnson County and settled in Paintsville, where he continued his teaching.

Thomas served as clerk of Johnson County Court. He was elected a member of the Kentucky House of Representative and served from 1873 to 1875. In 1875, he became Postmaster of Paintsville, He held the position for eight years. The house in which he lived served as the post office, by using a section of his porch for this purpose.

As the son John C.C. Mayo began to accumulate wealth, he built this house for his parents on Second Street.

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
