Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Alumni Gym is a one-and one-half-story, rectangular plan, eleven bay building constructed in 1923. The building has a concrete foundation, gable roof of composition shingles, and shiplap siding. On the main (north) facade are three pairs of double doors - the west and east bay doors are original five panel design while the central bay doors are ca. 1970 additions. Windows are six-over-six original rectangular sash. On the east facade are ca. 1970 sliding track doors. Other doors on the building are original two and six panels wood design.

In the half-story are original six light casement clerestory windows grouped in sections of three on both the east and west facades. Beneath the eaves are exposed eave rafters and brackets. At the roofline are three small gable monitor roof extensions with exposed eave rafters and shiplap siding. The interior is a large open gymnasium with wood basketball court, post and lintel construction and timber frame truss ceiling. Interior walls have horizontal board siding. The wings were designed to house the bleachers which have been removed. The west wing has been partitioned with added frame walls for use by the maintenance department. At the rear is a ca. 1970 frame office building which is non-contributing to the property. The building is located on the western edge of the Maryville College campus and is adjacent to the boundary of the Maryville College Historic District but it is not viable to include it in the district.

The Alumni Gym is significant under criterion A for its association with the early 20th century development of Maryville College. The building was constructed in 1923 to serve as the school's first recreational facility and was the main gym on campus until the construction of a new facility in the 1970s. It served primarily to house the school's basketball court and was built with shed roof wings to house the bleacher sections. The building continues to be used as a sports facility by Maryville College.

The Alumni Gym was completed in 1923 as part of the athletic campaign during the years 1920 to 1921. A campaign "to raise \$50,000 to provide for the College a modern gymnasium and an adequate athletic field" was opened by former students and the Alumni Association. Professors Horace E. Orr and Edwin R. Hunter were selected to direct the \$50,000 campaign. The architect for the building is unknown but the design was for a large frame vernacular structure with a gable roof and clerestory windows. Upon completion the building served to house basketball, volleyball and other sports activities. The building was the primary center for these college sports until the construction of a new gymnasium in recent years. The building continues to be used for sporting events by the college.


