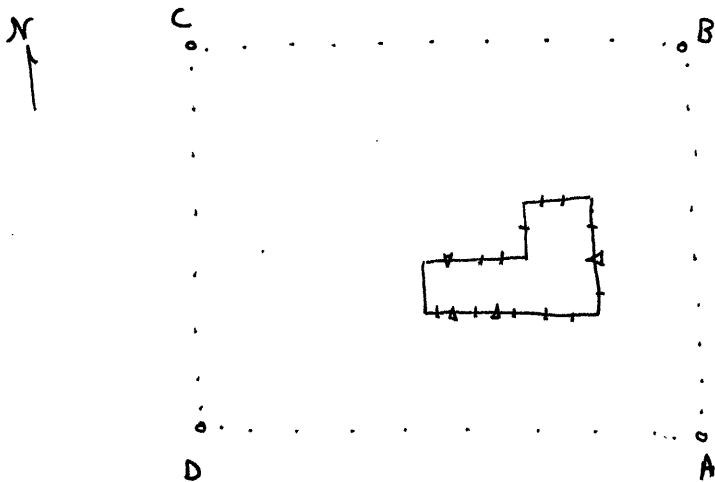

The house rests in a domestic space bounded on all sides by a fence. Beginning at point A, approximately 50' from the SE corner of the house; thence along a fence to point B, approximately 50' from the NE corner of the house; thence along a fence to point C, approximately 50' from the NW corner of the house; thence S to point D, approximately 50' from the SW corner of the house; thence E along a fence line to the beginning.
